At this time, Senator Slom rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

“Thank you. You may recall in my Opening Day remarks I talked about the problem as I saw it of bad behavior by people within government and the lack of consequences. On Friday, the so-called Special Internal Committee of the Office of Elections reported on the terrible behavior that was the 2012 State of Hawai'i elections, where people were denied their right to vote. As expected, unfortunately, this internal committee said that there would be no action, no consequences, no one would lose their job or be suspended or be reprimanded in any way: that we would just go on a different path.

“I was reminded this morning, colleagues, that had this happened in a southern state, or in a state where people felt that their denial of their basic civil right of being able to vote had been impaired, there would be lawsuits, there would be editorials, there would be people clamoring to do something. But unfortunately, as we saw in the University of Hawai'i investigations and other things, we seem to turn a blind eye to things that are right around us. And I for one, having heard again from many constituents, know that the public is unhappy about this. And of all the institutions they've looked toward, they haven't looked toward the media, and they haven't looked toward the university or the Office of Elections; they look toward the Senate to do something about this miscarriage of justice. Fortunately, we have several pieces of legislation that might address this.

“So I urge my colleagues again to be vigilant. When we have things that happen, we have to have consequences for those
