Her career spanned more than four decades. She worked as a University of Hawai'i professor and started her political career before Hawai'i statehood; and, as Chairman of the County Board of Supervisors in the sixties, was the first woman mayor in the state and the first woman to hold an executive position in local state government. She served in the State House until she retired at age 88. Madam President, she was a formidable champion for all people, and she fought the good fight longer

than many of us in the Legislature have been alive. So, I request that adjournment."
