**SENATE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions (S.R. Nos. 1 and 2) were read by the Clerk and were disposed of as follows:

S.R. No. 1 “SENATE RESOLUTION ADDING A NEW SENATE RULE 91 TO THE RULES OF THE SENATE OF THE TWENTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.”

Offered by: Senators Galuteria, Slom.

Senator Espero moved that S.R. No. 1 be adopted, seconded by Senator Slom.

Senator Slom rose to make the following remarks:

“First of all, I think that the pin is outstanding and all that, but I’d like to know a little bit about the background, where it was manufactured, how many there are in existence, and so forth.”

The Chair responded as follows:

“It was designed here, and I believe it was manufactured in Vietnam. Is that correct?”

The Clerk responded in the affirmative.

The Chair continued:

“And we ordered 175 pins.”

Senator Slom responded as follows:

“Well, as I said, they’re beautiful pins, and I think we’re very proud to have them and all that, but I’m a little discouraged since we always have a campaign of ‘buy local, use local, make local,’ and all that, and the pins are made in Vietnam?”

The Chair replied:

“Yes, and part of that was for the cost.”

Senator English rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“This is exactly what an economic system does; we often have to go for cheapest cost of any product in a globalized market, because the criticism might have been, ‘Why did we spend so much on locally produced if we could get cheaper elsewhere?’ So herein lies the problem of laissez-faire economy, globalized economy, and the issues of local production and price points. So, the Minority Leader did an excellent job of pointing it out, but he didn’t give the entire story of the entire economic debate. So, I wanted to say thank you for looking at the best price, saving the taxpayers of Hawai’i some money, and helping us find a very good product. Mahalo.”

The Chair responded:

“Thank you. I was very aware of the cost, and I know we would get criticized if we spent a lot of money on a pin for the Senate, so that was a main consideration.”

Senator Slom rose in response as follows:

“Yes, Madam President, just a brief comment about that. I appreciate the good senator’s remarks, because I certainly am in favor of – totally and always – for laissez-faire, and I do believe that. I think it’s just that sometimes we have conflicting statements and conflicting policies, and I’m always for the economizing and using the best possible practices, and so I salute you in this endeavor. Thank you.”

Senator English responded:

“Yes, Madam President, to clarify that the conflicting statements often come from the Minority Leader himself – advocating for a laissez-faire economy and advocating for open and free markets, and then the next statement is saying, ‘Why aren’t we buying local?’ when the price is higher. So, thank you for pointing out the conflicts and the contradictions in your own statements. Mahalo.”

The motion to adopt S.R. No. 1 was then put by the Chair and carried.
