"Madam President, I rise in support of SB 2495, SD3, Relating to Electronic Smoking Devices.

"E-cigarettes are battery-powered devices, often resembling cigarettes, designed to deliver nicotine or other substances in the form of vapor smoke that is breathed in and then exhaled. Electronic cigarettes have been on the U.S. market since 2007. Since 2008, sales of e-cigarettes in the U.S. have doubled each year, with sales in 2013 estimated to reach \$1,700,000,000.

"Electronic cigarettes are manufactured without regulatory oversight or quality control. Most come from China, which has a poor record for product purity. They are promoted, advertised and sold without health warnings or legal age restrictions.

"More and more of our youth are trying and using e-cigarettes.

- The percentage of high school students who reported ever using e-cigarettes rose from 4.7 percent in 2011 to 10 percent in 2012.

- Additionally, 1 in 5 middle school students who reported ever using e-cigarettes say they have never tried tobacco products.

"CDC Director Tom Frieden said: 'Nicotine is a highly addictive drug. Many teens who start with e-cigarettes may be condemned to struggling with a lifelong addiction to nicotine and conventional cigarettes.'

"Repeated doses of nicotine alter the brain's activities, reducing receptors that carry dopamine – the chemical that makes us feel good – to brain cells. Making the smoker dependent on nicotine to maintain normal levels of dopamine in the brain. There's an even greater concern about the effects of nicotine on adolescent brain development.

"SB2495, SD3 will include electronic smoking devices within the definition of 'tobacco products,' subjecting them to the same licensing permitting requirements as cigarettes and other tobacco products.

"This act will establish a currently unspecified excise tax percentage on electronic smoking devices. It will also amend Hawaii's anti-smoking statute to prohibit the use of e-cigarettes in public places and places of employment.

"Our current lack of regulation only promotes the idea that e-cigarettes are safe; this notion is false. By not regulating e-cigarettes, we continue to do a disservice to the public and especially our youth. I ask my fellow colleagues to vote yes and pass this measure to the House for further discussion."
