The Senate of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2014, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair

Thank you for that wonderful agreement. Madam President, my point of inquiry was to insert them into the Journal, if you would be so kind as to permit that." (The Chair so ordered.)

"Thank you. You're just wonderful this morning. I want everybody to know up there how wonderful you are. Thank you, Madam President."

The Chair having so ordered, Senator Hee's remarks read as follows:

"The purpose of this measure is to redefine the offense of computer damage in the first degree as intentionally causing or attempting to cause damage to a computer, computer system, or computer network that manages or controls critical infrastructure and increases it to a class A felony; redefine the offense of computer damage in the second degree; and creates a new offense of computer damage in the third degree. Your Committee on Judiciary and Labor passed this unamended.

"The Senate is agreeing to the House amendments that clarified the definition of 'critical infrastructure' specified that the offense of Computer Damage in the First Degree applies to damage to state and federal critical infrastructure."

Senator Thielen rose to inform the members that the Senate collectively donated over 571 pounds of canned and dried food to the Hawaii Foodbank, with Senator Chun Oakland's office gathering over 170 pounds of food to win a lunch served by Senator Thielen and her staff. Senator Thielen also thanked the Senate Sergeant-at-Arms staff for gathering and delivering the donated food to the Foodbank.
