Thursday, January 29, 2015

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Fifth Day.

Senator Espero congratulated Suzanne Marinelli on the occasion of her retirement from service in Hawai'i's Public Access Room, and presented the following remarks:

"Madam President, colleagues, guests: Today we celebrate the retirement of a very special member of our legislative 'ohana: Ms. Suzanne Marinelli. But before detailing her work and the impact she has had at the Capitol, I want to talk a little about the Public Access Room, which she managed and provided leadership.

"In 1990, the State Legislature established the Public Access Room as a way to assist the public in the legislative process. It has become a one-stop shop for visitors, advocates, citizens, and even legislators who are looking for ways to better engage in the public policy process. The PAR office is more than just a place to receive expert help to navigate the often-complicated process in this building. It offers free resources for a variety of legislative-related tasks. Some of those resources include the use of general office supplies; comfortable workplace; complete hard copy version of the HRS, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, and other documents; and computers with Internet access.

"PAR, as Suzanne would say, is about people and process. PAR goes beyond just an in-house resource; PAR is committed to the continual education and outreach of the government process to our citizens. They hold in-house workshops and community-based workshops to bring awareness of government to our citizens.

"Much of the hard work and success of PAR can be attributed to our honoree this morning. Suzanne spent 14 years working to promote the relationship between everyday citizens and the Legislature by – to name a few – developing workshops, neighbor island outreach programs, coordinating the Legislature's broadcast project, coordinating the National Conference of State Legislatures Back to School Program, and speaking at many NCSL annual conferences to share Hawai'i's public access program with other states. And we were the first state in the nation to adopt this Public Access Room.

"I, along with my staff, will fondly remember working with her to schedule 'Ōlelo broadcasts, assisting with constituent requests, and her love for the legislative process. I wish her the very best as she starts her new and exciting chapter in life away from the pressures of the Capitol, but I hope and I know she will come to visit us often.

"In having a short conversation with her just this morning, she made it clear: Now, she will be able to state her opinion and, when necessary, scold the House of Representatives and the senators for something that we should not be doing.

"So with that, colleagues, if you could please welcome Suzanne Marinelli. With Suzanne is Virginia Beck, who has been at the office for seven years and who will be taking over for Suzanne. Thank you, Madam President."

Senator Ihara rose to present the following remarks:

"Madam President, I join our Vice President and colleagues in congratulating our 17-year veteran of the Public Access

Room on a job well done and to relay our best wishes on a well-deserved retirement to Suzanne Marinelli.

"As one of the initiators of the Public Access Room 25 years ago, I've seen it grow and provide excellent service to our visitors to the Capitol. We've all seen the results in much more useful testimonies before our committees, because it wasn't always that way.

"Under Suzanne's leadership, the Public Access Room greatly expanded its public outreach, including to the neighbor islands. When she became PAR coordinator in 2000, Suzanne started accepting the nation's first public testimonies by email. I recall her staff printing out those emails and delivering them to the committees. The email testimonies expanded over time, and in 2005, over 4,000 email testimonies were received at the Public Access Room. By the time the House and Senate took over the program in 2007, the number tripled to 12,500 testimonies received by email. And I believe we're one of the nation's legislatures that receive the most testimonies by email.

"Suzanne has been successful in expanding public access by making new initiatives – like email testimonies – workable for the Legislature. Some might say she used technology to carve a path for the Legislature to increase public access to the legislative process, and indeed, she has.

"Thank you, Suzanne, for your innovative spirit, hard work, and dedication to our democracy. We wish you all the best as you spread your creativity beyond the Capitol. Thank you."

Senator Slom rose to present the following remarks:

"Thank you, Madam President. On behalf of the Senate Minority, I want to thank Suzanne as well. She's been helpful to everyone on a nonpartisan basis. I think that the Public Access Room is one of the best things that the Legislature has done. It has worked well; it has helped many people. Behind the statistics are living, breathing men and women and children who have been helped; and I think a large part of this has been Suzanne herself and her personality and her willingness to go beyond the call. I know I've been involved in organizations that invited her to make community presentations on the weekends and the evenings, and it was never an issue or a question; she was always there, she and her staff. It reflects upon her leadership and her abilities over these many years. I wish her well in her retirement, and I, too, am looking forward to those comments on how we could do better. Aloha. Thank you."

Senator Tokuda rose to present the following remarks:

"I actually just wanted to add some comments and well-wishes. Thank you. I was very, very fortunate to be one of the very first people to meet Suzanne when she came to the Public Access Room. I was working there during my senior year in 1994, and along with fellow students Lana Yoshimura, Blayne Higa, and Roy Bumgarner, the Public Access Room was kind of our afterschool education, our very own YMCA, if you will. And while Suzanne will often say that we helped educate her on the ins and outs of the legislative process and on advocacy, she really was the one who taught all of us so very much.

"Over the years, she's transformed what was a simple room filled with a few computers – and boy, they were really old back then, by the way – it was just tables and message boxes. If you can recall, members, we were not paperless by any means, so we had boxes for advocates and for lobbyists alike, where we stuffed every version of every bill and every hearing notice into the cubby holes. All of those things, in a very simple room, and she transformed it into a beautiful, beautiful room that it is today and into an open, transparent space filled with both her art

and the knowledge that she's acquired over the years. It really is something that we all have treasured and something that we all believe has become a part of this building.

"So, thank you so much for what you have done to make sure that this is a really open place; this is the people's home and that they feel welcome and comfortable coming here. You're so deserving that you can now retire and enjoy your years, but please feel free to come back at any time and be a part of this home that you've helped to create for so many of us. Mahalo for all that you've done."

Senator Ruderman rose to present the following remarks:

"Yes, I just want to briefly add my congratulations and mahalo, too. The first time I met Suzanne was shortly after my first election and before I started serving here. I went to one of her community outreach meetings, which are so important on the neighbor islands where people don't have the same access to the Legislature. I thought I was attending in support of her coming to my community, but it turned out I was attending to educate myself. I actually learned more at that one two-hour meeting about the legislative process than I had learned in my entire life up to that point. She really engaged people with humor and lively stories, and everybody in the room was attentive and appreciative. I know she's been out to the community many times since, but I can't overemphasize the importance of the community outreach aspect of the work that she's done. Thank you very much."

At 11:45 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
