

SEVENTEENTH DAY

Wednesday, February 18, 2015

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Sixteenth Day.

Senator Dela Cruz welcomed Robert Kaiwai, Consul General of New Zealand; Holly Warren, Deputy Consul General of New Zealand; Jacob Hamstra, policy advisor, Consulate General of New Zealand; former New Zealand All Blacks players Walter Little, Frank Bunce, and Charles Riechelmann; and Dallen Stanford, program director for Play Rugby USA. The delegation was working with the Department of Education and other state agencies to discuss the vision of adding rugby to afterschool programs to teach children the concepts of leadership, communication, positive motivation, sportsmanship, and teamwork.

Senator Shimabukuro extended additional thanks to the Play Rugby USA delegation for their outreach efforts at Wai'anae Intermediate School, then introduced the following community members from the E Alu Pū and Maui Nui Makai Networks, a grassroots network of over 32 communities across the state involved in caring for their cultural and natural resources: Presley Wann and Keli'i Alapai of Hui Maka'āinana o Makana in Hā'ena, Kaua'i; Mac Poepoe of Hui Mālama o Mo'omomi in Mo'omomi, Moloka'i; former State Representative Sol Kaho'ohalahala of Maunalei Ahupua'a in Maunalei, Lāna'i; Greg Lind and Scott Crawford of Kīpahulu 'Ōhana in Kīpahulu, Maui; Jay Carpio of Wailuku Community Marine Managed Area in Wailuku, Maui; Ekolū Lindsey of Polanui Community Marine Managed Area in Polanui, Maui; Charlie Young of Kama'āina United to Protect the 'Āina (KUPA) in Ho'okena, Hawai'i; Reggie Lee and Kekaulike Tomich of Ka'ūpūlehu Marine Life Advisory Committee (KMLAC) in Ka'ūpūlehu; Ted Blake of Mālama Kōloa in Kōloa, Kaua'i; Frazer McGilvray of Mālama Maunalua in Maunalua, O'ahu; and Kukana Kama-Toth of Na Kua'āina O Waimānalo in Waimānalo, O'ahu.

Senator Galuteria extended an additional welcome to former State Representative Sol Kaho'ohalahala, with whom he sailed as a crew member of the *Hōkūlea* during its voyage through the Society Islands and Cook Islands in 1994.

Senator Galuteria then congratulated the Christian community in Hawai'i on their recognition of February 17, 2015, as Henry Opukaha'ia Day, celebrating the legacy of the first Hawaiian Christian whose advocacy led to the pivotal first Christian mission to Hawai'i from Boston, Massachusetts in 1819. Recognized in the gallery were family members and supporters including Deborah Lee, a relative of Henry Opukaha'ia; Ahahui O Opukaha'ia, the group responsible for returning the remains of Henry Opukaha'ia to Hawai'i in 1993; and Leon Siu, director of Christian Voice of Hawai'i.

Senator Thielen extended an additional welcome to the guests from the community-based marine fisheries management areas, recognized their hard work over the past few decades, and invited the members to meet with the community advocates the following morning to discuss their initiatives.

Senator Kouchi extended additional recognition to Ted Blake, and praised the many puakenikeni lei he has strung for various members of the Senate.

"This is, again, an emergency appropriation. It's for payroll shortfall, and the shortfall occurred when we had a transition from the former governor to the new governor. There are a number of things in this bill, some of which are noteworthy, but the personnel matters: We're paying for expenditures for people to move from the former administration, a politically appointed job, to a new politically appointed job, often with the city or with another government agency. Again, I think that we should be mindful that these are taxpayer funds, and we're talking about, in this case, nearly \$700,000. All of these amounts add up and only our residents can pay them. Thank you."

I would like to add, before we adjourn on a moment of silence for Representative Mele Carroll, that I’ve known her family for most of her life; her dad, Wayne Soares, and I were very good friends. As a matter of fact, when I first came down here in January 2011, one of the first people I went to see was Mele Carroll. I talked to her and told her, ‘Mele, I know your dad and your mom, Maggie, and for all those years I’ve known your dad, he gave me a gift back in 1982.’ He, along with others – my friends and his friends, the ‘ohana – took a ceramic class in ‘Ewa Beach. Wayne Soares made this for me [*holds up a ceramic mug*], and I put it on my mantel in my home; and when I came down here, I took it up and showed Mele and we had a good chat about her father and the good memories.

“I can tell you, colleagues, that every day is special. Hawai‘i is a special place, and don’t forget to tell those people that you love – don’t hesitate; don’t let the moment pass without telling them, your family and those that you love, that you love them.

“This past Valentine’s Day, a whole week had gone by, and I had called a family friend to get her phone number, and they gave it to me. It took me about a week to get to Mele, to tell her and tell her family. And I guess, for me, it was meant to be; it was on Valentine’s Day that I called and left a message for her family, to tell Mele that I loved her. So when I heard today that she had passed, I was sad but I also know that she’s now with her dad. And so it’s in their honor that I brought this cup to be here with me today on the Senate floor. Thank you, Madam President.”
