

EIGHTEENTH DAY

Thursday, February 19, 2015

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Seventeenth Day.

Senator Galuteria recognized retired teachers and members of the Hawaii State Teachers Association who were present in the gallery.

Senator Tokuda welcomed members of the Lambda Chi Omega Chapter of the Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority, the first Greek letter organization established by African American college women in 1908 at Howard University in Washington, D.C. The members were present in the gallery to support their sorority sister Bettye Jo Harris; among them were Vice President Michelle Dewberry, Patricia Pope, Linda Mitchell, Barbara Mitchell, LaJohnne White, Sandi Sumbry, Erica Williams, and Carolyn Williams.

Senator Tokuda then recognized and commended Bettye Jo Harris for receiving the NAACP Lifetime Achievement Award for Distinguished Service, and presented the following remarks:

"Thank you, Madam President. It is my honor and pleasure to introduce a very dear friend; a matriarch of Kaneohe; a civil rights trailblazer; a model community organizer; and a loving wife, mother, and grandmother – Mrs. Bettye Jo Harris.

"While there have been countless opportunities over the years when we could have brought her to the Senate floor to be honored, I am glad we could recognize her today as a recipient of the NAACP's Lifetime Achievement Award for Distinguished Service. Bettye Jo has led the fight for equality and civil rights here in Hawai'i since 1962, working tirelessly on behalf of minorities, the underserved, and the needy. Alphonso Braggs, president of the Honolulu branch of the NAACP, has said, 'Bettye Jo has spearheaded every monumental civil rights advance in the state, and Hawai'i and the world is a much better place because of the work she has done.' She has advised governors, served on state and county commissions, and stood side by side some of Hawai'i's most recognized civil rights leaders, such as the late Congresswoman Patsy Mink, with whom she worked on a particular measure you all might be familiar with called Title IX.

"From serving as director of Hina Mauka to working as the director of the Kalihi-Palama Immigrant Service Center, to sitting as president of the Hawai'i Council of Churches and serving as a member of the YWCA and League of Women

Voters, the accolades are too many to mention. And I just consider myself so blessed to call Bettye Jo a friend.

"Colleagues, please join me once again in acknowledging Mrs. Bettye Jo Harris for all that she has done for our state and our country. She also has with her today her internationally recognized entomologist husband who did research on the fruit flies over at CTAHR, Dr. Ernest Harris."

ORDER OF THE DAY**RE-REFERRAL OF A SENATE BILL**

The Chair re-referred the following Senate bill that was introduced:

S.B. No. 1026 Committee on Ways and Means

Senator Ruderman rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"I'd like to just share with the members the sad news of the passing of the most iconic and influential member of my community: Robert Keli'ihō'omalū, widely known as Uncle Robert, passed away a few days ago. He was from Kalapana and really, it's hard to picture Kalapana without thinking of Uncle Robert.

"In the 1990s, when lava threatened the community, lava flowed along the border of his property after having claimed over 200 other homes and flowed to the sea, a half-mile out to sea, creating a large chunk of new land right next to his property, and then flowed to the ocean about a quarter-mile on the other side. But Uncle Robert's family never evacuated, and in fact, they made the best of it. They created a place unlike any other that's locally known as 'Uncle's Lava Bar' or just simply 'Uncle Robert's.' Literally at the end of the road, they made use of the lava fields and of the incredible amount of new land that was given. They claimed sovereignty over it and practiced sovereignty.

"Contained in his name, 'ho'omalū' is the phrase 'peacemaker,' and really, Uncle Robert made peace with so many people in the community. He made peace with the American government; he made peace with our Hawai'i County government and with Pele herself. For example, no police ever go onto their property; there are no hassles, there are no problems there, because they enforce their own sense of law there. And they – 'they' being his family – are so highly respected that they have never been challenged in that regard.

"Learning to live with Pele – or lava, if you prefer – is a lesson we're also learning in Puna. And Uncle Robert did so with respect, with aloha, resiliency and faith, a sense of community, and a great sense of fun; and in that sense, we had a wonderful teacher in Uncle Robert. He was an arbiter of disputes throughout the community, kind of like a king. He was revered and respected and his decisions were not challenged, not because of an iron fist, but rather because of a golden heart. Everyone who met him describes him as 'regal,' 'exuding strength,' and 'remarkably humble.'

"Kalapana's famous for its musical heritage, and he was no exception. Along with his wife, G-Girl, they played music for decades, and his sons carried on the tradition in what was known as the Kalapana 'Awa Band. It's great music: They had great energy, wonderful harmonies – not 'had,' they still have. And the family accepted all; they accepted everyone who wanted to be part of their scene. I was honored to share the stage with them many times and played at the 'Awa Bar myself and am happy to call Uncle Robert a mentor.

"They created something called a Wednesday Night Market, which is an evening farmers' market. It's an absolutely unique situation that attracts 500 to 1,000 people every week to a place literally at the end of the road that seemed forgotten about at one point. Uncle made a sign that, I'm paraphrasing here, said, 'Everyone is welcome. Please share our home. Have fun. But intolerance, hatred, or violence are not welcome.' And he enforced that with great love and aloha. It's a place where Hawaiians, local kids, visitors, hippies, gays and lesbians, old and young all mix every week in peace and genuine harmony,

having fun and growing community. I invite any of you who are interested to come and visit, and I almost guarantee you'll agree that there's no place like it on earth.

"Why I'm telling you this: I just feel it was important to share his story of aloha and there's few people of which anyone can say that the community would not be the same without them, but that something could be said of Uncle Robert. I'm not calling for a moment of silence; I'd rather we celebrate his life than mourn his death. But he was really the best example of aloha that I've ever seen, in spirit and in action, and he changed the world for the better. Uncle Robert's legacy, and more important, the influence of his aloha, will outlive any of us here today. Thank you, Madam President."

Senator Dela Cruz rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"I just want to congratulate Dane Wicker from my office and his wife, Rosella, on becoming parents last night to their newly born son, Pierce Kenneth Leonhardt-Wicker. So congratulations to Dane and Rosella."

Senator Thielen rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Many of you may know that Al Lewis has passed away, if you've seen the announcements. I was at his wake this morning, but I wanted to notify folks that there will be a scattering of his ashes Saturday off of Waimānalo, at the Kaiona boat ramp. We will be inviting his family here on April 1st to celebrate his life, and so I'll leave some remarks about what a wonderful man he was for then, but for those of you who want to say a final farewell to Al: Saturday, 10:00, Kaiona boat ramp at Waimānalo."

The Chair then made the following announcement:

"The deadline to file standing committee reports on Senate bills that need to pass Second Reading and move laterally to the final Senate committee is 9:00 p.m. this evening."
