

## THIRTY-FOURTH DAY

Tuesday, March 24, 2015

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Third Day.

Senator Gabbard honored and commended Permablitz Hawai'i, and presented the following remarks:

"Madam President, colleagues: I would like to introduce Permablitz Hawai'i. I see some of you scratching your heads, thinking, 'What the heck is a Permablitz?' First of all, for you football fans, this is not a new defensive scheme for the Seattle Seahawks. Actually, Permablitz is a volunteer network akin to the old-fashioned barn raisings common in the early days of our country. But instead of folks coming together to build barns, they come together on a designated day at someone's home to design and create edible landscapes – that's right, I said 'edible landscapes,' a.k.a. gardens – based on permacultural principles. There's a lot of talk story, a delicious potluck lunch, weed pulling, hole digging, and lots of fun.

"Permaculture is a design system for communities: It's about working with nature, caring for Mother Earth, caring for our neighbors, and the sharing of our resources. Volunteer workdays are held regularly to transform backyards, schools, or other public places into more efficient, functional, and productive spaces in a single day.

"Permablitzes began in Australia in 2006 as a collaboration between a permaculture designer and a community group. Since then, there have been hundreds organized throughout the world. On O'ahu, they've been happening on average about once a month since Permablitz arrived on our shores in 2011. Beyond the incredible gift of edible landscapes, Permablitz is as much about building community, teaching, learning, sharing, and living sustainably.

"We have here together the leaders of Permablitz Hawai'i; first is Matt Kamakani Lynch. We're happy to welcome Matt back from Vanuatu, where he survived Cyclone Pam. He was there consulting for the Adventist Development and Relief Agency when the recent devastating cyclone hit. Matt brought the first Permablitz to Hawai'i in 2011. He is a permaculture instructor and director of the Asia-Pacific Center for Regenerative Design. He's also the sustainability coordinator for the UH System.

"Next is Hunter Heavilin. Hunter has degrees in agroforestry management, sustainable community development, and his master's is in urban planning. He's a director of three local nonprofits: O'ahu Farm to School Network, Urban Farm Hawai'i, and the Asia-Pacific Center for Regenerative Design. He's a permaculture instructor also, who, along with Matt, is teaching the eighth permaculture design certificate course on O'ahu since 2012. Besides the local courses, between Matt and Hunter, they've taught in Moloka'i, Mongolia, Haiti, and Vanuatu.

"Next up is Allen Fanning. Allen is the coordinator of Permablitz Hawai'i. He's a natural and green builder focused on building with naturally sourced local materials. He's a certified permaculture designer, and he puts together renewable energy systems. He's one of the original founders of the community group Transition Oahu, a grassroots movement of citizens working to localize our economies and our food systems.

"Next up is Mike Davis. Mike is a member of the Permablitz hui of designers since almost the beginning. He helps with coordinating, and he sources materials for the blitzes, like mulch, manure, pallets – whatever's needed for the particular job.

"And finally, Rafael Bergstrom. Rafael is the Surfrider Foundation Oahu Chapter coordinator. He's the owner of Rafael Bergstrom Photography. He heads up SurfBlitz, a collaboration between Surfrider Foundation and Permablitz, to educate about and install ocean-friendly gardens, blitz-style.

"The Senate would like to honor Permablitz Hawai'i for revolutionizing our yards, our food supply, and our neighborhoods with healthy, edible gardens, bringing us closer to our aim of food self-reliance. We wish you unlimited success in spreading this community-building movement. Aloha.

"Madam President and colleagues, these guys didn't know this was going to happen today; we were meeting in my office at 11:00, discussing the reflecting pool and the issues that we're having with our reflecting pool. And I was kind of hoping that they would show up in their shorts and slippers as they were coming right out from the garden, but they didn't. Thank you."

At 11:40 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:47 a.m.
