Senator Green rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

"First of all, let me point out there our nominee, Dr. Pressler. Madam President, this is an extraordinary candidate that the governor has sent us. I'm going to refer to her as 'Ginny'; I'm very fond of her. If I slip back to 'Dr. Pressler', it's out of, really, just due deference to her extraordinary career. She was in banking before starting in cardiovascular research at Queen's for several years, where she was a junior fellow there. She went on to Harvard to work at the medical school, get degrees, University of Hawai'i Integrated Surgical Residency for six years. She was a private practice physician in our state, taking care of patients, and also was an associate professor of surgery, then became a vice president at Queen's, which is one of our preeminent hospitals, as we all know. Then she became president and CEO for HMSA's Premier Plan, Queen's Health dba. Then she went over to Hawai'i Pacific Health, which is the other preeminent health care system, and had a leadership role as executive vice president, not to mention all of those extraordinary credentials for Ginny. She also worked at the Department of Health as a deputy director for Health Resources Administration.

"She's a powerful advocate for those who need health care; she's been very, very close and embedded to the work we do here on coordinated care, care integration – always focusing on those who need it the most. She has extraordinary chops on taking care of women and women's health issues. There was not a single person who came and testified before us who didn't glow about Dr. Pressler, about Ginny. Really, an extraordinary candidate.

"I don't want to spend any more time than necessary singing her praises because she has so much work to do running an incredibly important department for us, but again, I would commend the governor and his team: They sent us one of the most extraordinary individuals we could hope for. She knows about the legacy of those who have preceded her, and was very, very kind and deferential to the work that Dr. Fuddy did, that Dr. Rosen has done. I mean, this is an extraordinary candidate, so I'd recommend that we all support her nomination."

Senator Baker rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

"I, too, rise in strong support of this nominee and would echo many of the words of our Health chair. I, too, have had an opportunity to work with Dr. Pressler over the years from Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition to American Cancer Society to a number of task forces looking at how we can reinvent our efforts to help everybody live a healthier lifestyle and obtain adequate health care coverage.

"She is an extraordinary leader. I'm delighted to see another woman at the head of this particularly important department for all of us, and I extend my very best wishes to her. She's got a great staff; she'll do a great job. Mahalo."

I'm going to run over some of his credentials: He's been with the department for quite some time; knows the department inside and out; is a passionate supporter of health for all. Keith worked at the John Howard Association of Hawaii for several years, then was a School-to-Work Transition Center leader as a career counselor, so he knows people. At Kaimuki School, he worked in their transition center as a program coordinator. He was with the Office of Youth Services in program development for several years. He's been with the Department of Health for a great deal of time as well. He was at the Office of Youth Services for children and youth program development; then was Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division Administrator, which, from my perspective, members, is one of the most important divisions in the Department of Health and in government because of the incredible challenges that we have with drug and alcohol addiction. So, it's such a wonderful addition to the team to have someone so well-versed in that issue.

"He spent years with the Department of Health as deputy director. He knows it inside and out, and again I will mention our late and dear departed Dr. Fuddy – he was at her side when she passed. He was at her side for the entire period, working with her, as she was director; he was her right-hand person. Really a compassionate individual who, serving as Dr. Pressler's deputy, will continue to round out our team in an extraordinary way. As Senator Baker pointed out, we only seem to put women in the directorship, but we will have an excellent deputy in Keith Yamamoto, if we will support him.

"So I don't forget later, we're so lucky to have June Yamamoto, his mom; Tracey Yamamoto-Kubo, his sister; and Nalani St. Germaine, his niece, today. So, if we could give them a round of applause, it would be wonderful. I know we haven't voted and we took applause out of order, but these are great individuals, Madam President."

Senator Baker rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

"Thank you, Madam President. I rise in strong support of this nominee, just so the nominee doesn't think I only stand in support of women candidates.

"I had the good fortune a number of years ago to chair the Senate Health Committee, and I had an opportunity to work very closely with Keith at that time, when he was the administrator for ADAD. I know that he is not only a fine individual, compassionate and caring, but he really understands

the importance of the programs in the Department of Health, and his leadership, I think, is going to be of great service to our new director. Because he's been in the bureaucracy, he understands it, and we all know that sometimes you have to have that understanding in order to move it.

"So thank you, Keith, for stepping up to the plate, and I urge all my colleagues to vote for his confirmation as well. Thank you."

"Madam President, I rise in strong support of HB 623 HD2 SD2.

"Our state is spending \$3 billion to \$5 billion annually on importing dirty fossil fuels, which is not good for the environment, our future sustainability, or our pocketbooks. Our islands are blessed with abundant, renewable energy provided to us by ke Akua. We should be using these resources for the benefit of our people and 'āina, and show the world that this can be done.

"HB 623 HD2 SD2 would raise the state's clean energy goals to 100 percent by 2050. This law would be the first in the nation to pass. We would also be the most populated set of islands in the world with an independent grid to establish a 100 percent renewable electricity goal. By moving forward, we can be the model that other states and even nations to follow. Scotland is on track to achieve its mandated target of 100 percent renewable power by 2020, and already last year, generated the equivalent of 98 percent of household electricity demand with local renewable sources. Several cities and counties on the mainland are committed to procuring 100 percent renewable electricity within the next decade, including Marin County, San Francisco, Lancaster, and Palo Alto in California; Georgetown, Texas; and East Hampton, New York. The State of Vermont has created a plan for reaching 90 percent renewable energy by 2050.

"If we're able to pull this off—and it's clear that this is doable—we'll achieve the biggest energy turnaround in the country, going from 90 percent dependence on fossil fuels to 100 percent clean energy. Let's do this! Mahalo."
