At this time, Senator Kouchi introduced Michael McEnerney, newly confirmed member of the Board of Regents of the University of Hawai'i, who was seated in the gallery.

Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Madam President and colleagues, we've had much discussion on our hospitals, and some of us are very proud of our hospitals, and I just wanted to make sure that this particular item didn't go unnoticed. It was in *Pacific Business News* the other day: It said three Hawai'i hospitals received 'A' grade for patient safety from Leapfrog Group. They got the top honor in the category of patient safety by a group that surveys hospitals throughout the country. I was pleased to see that Maui Memorial Medical Center, along with The Queen's Medical Center and Straub Clinic & Hospital of HPH, received the top grade of 'A' according to the report that was released on Wednesday.

"Since that time, there's been another category and we've had some more of our hospitals in the 'A' category, but overall, Hawai'i ranked number 12 in the nation for the safest hospitals, and I think that's a testament not only to the quality of the staff that we have, but I think it really says why some of us have been fighting so hard to make sure that we have that quality of hospital on the island of Maui. But I wanted to share that Maine was number 1, and the survey covers approximately 2,500 hospitals across the country, and only one-third of them got an 'A' grade. Thank you very much."
