Wednesday, January 27, 2016

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2016, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

At this time, the Chair introduced the following guests to the members of the Senate:

The Chair also recognized additional guests in the gallery and thanked them for their attendance.

At this time, Mr. Kai Kahele, son of Senator Gilbert Kahele, delivered the following remarks:

"Members of the Senate: My father loved history, especially World War II history. And he would often read famous speeches by famous leaders in our country, and one of his most favorite speeches was by General Douglas MacArthur. It was his farewell speech given to the corps of cadets at West Point on May 12, 1962, and I'd just like to read you the last few paragraphs of that speech because I really believe it summarizes this moment:

The shadows are lengthening for me. The twilight is here. My days of old have vanished – tone and tints. They have gone glimmering through the dreams of things that were. Their memory is one of wondrous beauty, watered by tears and coaxed and caressed by the smiles of yesterday. I listen then, but with thirsty ear, for the witching melody of faint bugles blowing reveille, of far drums beating the long roll.

In my dreams I hear again the crash of guns, the rattle of musketry, the strange, mournful mutter of the battlefield. But in the evening of my memory I come back to West Point. Always there echoes and re-echoes: Duty, Honor, Country.

Today marks my final roll call with you. But I want you to know that when I cross the river, my last conscious thoughts will be of the Corps, and the Corps, and the Corps.

I bid you farewell.

At this time, Senator Keith-Agaran acknowledged the presence of Associate Justice Sabrina S. McKenna and Associate Justice Richard W. Pollack of the Supreme Court, State of Hawai'i, in the gallery.

Senator Galuteria rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“Thank you, Mr. President. The Hawaiian word for grief, colleagues: kaumaha. And today we feel kaumaha, kaumaha loa – a deep, long grief. I’d like to tell you that I never thought about today; none of us thought about today. And I never imagined I’d be here, having to say these words in front of you all, but it’s so much easier for us to mourn in silence the loss of

a good friend. But silence or not, one thing which I am sure we all appreciate today is being here together, sharing in each other's silence and sharing in each other's moments of thoughts for Senator Kahele, who we all loved as a friend, as a father, as a husband, a brother, and a colleague. And like all of you, Gil was our friend.

"Equally important, he was the older brother I never had. We had this special friendship, and by God's doing, we quickly became closer; and so by the time we got deep into his first session with us here at the Legislature, we already knew about our lives and our families and our dreams and our hopes, and we spent a lot of time together about 4:00 every afternoon in somebody's office, talking about it. Since then, we shared countless moments as brothers and colleagues often do. We often addressed each other formally – Senator Kahele, Senator Galuteria – and why did we do that? Because our acknowledgement of our station carried great responsibility. And thanks to him, I learned, and thanks to him, I became a better person. If I were to mention all the things I learned from Gil Kahele, I'd be going on all day. But I will say that I owe him so much.

"When the winds of politics turn against you – we all have that happen to us every now and then; we know that. When it turned against me, I became bitter and despondent. And then Senator Kahele walked into my office one day, the wise sage of our Senate – and I'm not sure if he's older than you, Senator Slom – but he told me, 'You know, brother, you must be magnanimous; you must be humble; you must be benevolent, because this, too, shall pass.' And it did. And when those winds whip up again, I have the words of Gil Kahele to tighten and lighten the load.

"Senator Kahele was a great Hawaiian with great aloha. He loved his Hawaiian people and often talked of justice and reconciliation – but not through acquiescence – but with a kū'ē and respect at the same time.

"As we can see, he was a proud Marine – Semper Fi, always loyal. He often told me that we must be strategic; we must be ready, and when the time is right, carpe diem, seize the day! Imagine a Hawaiian from Miloli'i talking Latin to you.

"I do not know what it will be like later on today, when I do not receive the call, you know, when I do not receive the text. 'Where art thou?' he would text, or 'Where you stay, brah?' He'd give me a call, and maybe it was a new joke or maybe some political intelligence that only Gil Kahele could uncover or maybe just a simple 'How's the 'ohana, brah?' In the understanding, though, that this is real; this is real. Our brother is gone, but he sits on our shoulder right now. He's in a better place, with friends like Geno Kaupiko – yeah, Senator Inouye? – Harry Ruddle, and Don Ho, as an example.

"And when I was visiting him – and I had the pleasure of representing us all at his bedside – and he was explaining to me about the lands of Kapu'a and the college of aviation, and he was going on and on and on, and he had his IV running. And then the phone rang, and his wife, Linda, her ringer is Don Ho singing 'Tiny Bubbles.' And in true Gil Kahele fashion, he turned to Linda – he says, 'Linda, don't answer that phone; I'm not ready to talk to him yet.' And he called twice.

"But I must say, colleagues, we feel the grief today, kaumaha, kaumaha loa, so I ask that we all conduct ourselves the way Senator Kahele did, and if we do, I'm confident that this will be a session that we all can remember. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Nishihara rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Upon hearing about the passing of my dear friend, Senator Gilbert Kahele, I was both shocked and saddened, as were those others who also received that news. I remembered the many times he came to my office, and I to his, to talk about what was happening in the Senate and his strong resolve to see certain projects become reality. He will be remembered for his steadfast and determined efforts to bring the Daniel K. Inouye School of Pharmacy to Hilo and his equally important project of the small aircraft school and the important and abandoned airfield in Hilo.

"We also spoke about our families: his grandchildren, his love for all of them, as I with mine. We spoke about what was really important in our lives. He and I realized, as important as our roles as legislators were, it was not the most important, nor the most significant.

"His beliefs and character were the principles of duty, honor, and country. He was a proud Marine. He and I were one of a few in our Legislature who were veterans. I reflected on that again when Governor Ige asked those in the chamber who were active duty and retired military to stand and be recognized – Gil Kahele wasn't there to receive that recognition that day; he was in the hospital. I and many others kept him in our prayers and thoughts when he was admitted into Queen's Hospital. We all hoped and expected him to rejoin us again.

"Today I reflect and honor Gil for his friendship, his kindness, his commitment to his community and to his country; he will be missed. In our mourning, we bear our sorrows and offer our love and condolences and support to his family. He served his country, his community, his family and his friends, and colleagues well here, in the Senate. We could ask for no finer a friend, no more honorable a man, no more beloved a family man, than Gil Kahele. As General Douglas MacArthur spoke many years ago: 'Old soldiers never die; they just fade away.' I hope and believe that this Marine and our colleague, in our memories, will not just fade away. Thank you."

Senator Slom rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Thank you. We have lost a dear colleague; the family has lost a very special man; Hawai'i has lost a true leader. There were a lot of words said yesterday, but this man goes far beyond words – it's deeds and action.

"As the only member of the other party in this body, I think I'm in a unique position to talk about the respect, the friendship, the guidance that Senator Kahele shared with me over the last five years. We didn't talk about politics, oh, except that every day, he tried to get me to sign a Democrat Party card – **every day!** But we talked about family; we talked about the future of Hawai'i; we talked about his pride in being a Marine, his patriotism. He's a unique man, and that's why all of us feel so saddened yesterday and today. As the senator from Waikīkī said, there's a time for passing and a time for grief.

"But Senator Kahele would want us to rise above that and to show, by our actions and by our deeds that, in fact, we can make Hawai'i a better place. It's true that he would walk the halls and pop into an office and have a conversation; we all valued that. But the thing that I'll remember is how he treated young people and staff and new people in this building. There was no class; there was no, 'Well, I've been here longer.' He was particularly good to first-timers, and he had that twinkle in his eye all the time. And those jokes, sometimes you had to hear them two or three times to get them, but he had a good sense of humor. He was a good man.

"And so I join with the good senator from Waikīkī to say that the best thing that we can do to honor the memory of our dear departed colleague is to do the things that he did – not the words that were said, but what he did, a living example. And I know I take away a lot of personal memories, too, but most of

all, Senator Kahele was and is a gentleman and the right man for the times to make Hawai'i better. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator English rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"When Senator Kahele first came to the Senate, I remember him coming to my office, and he said something very striking. He said, 'Okay, you're one of the older, longer-serving senators,' – not older in age – 'one of the older senators here. What should I do?' And I thought about it and I said, 'Well, maybe you should observe the first session.' And he did. And then later, he came back and he said, 'Eh, thanks ah. I didn't know this; I didn't know that.' I said, 'So what do you plan to do, Senator Kahele?' He says, 'Next session, I get um.' And he did: He knew how to do his bills; he knew how to do his CIP request; he knew how to request for the things that his district needed. And he was highly successful.

"For me, he became the grandfather figure in my life. I was raised by my grandparents, and I miss them dearly, and I think Senator Kahele sensed that, because he would come in and say, 'Everything okay at home? You're working too hard; make sure you spend some time back with your family.' Always checking in, always making sure that I was okay. So we developed a close friendship.

"Many of you don't know that he liked to travel, and he traveled in the South Pacific. I'm going to share one very quick story because I couldn't figure out how he did this. We had to go to Palau, and, as Kai said, he was a history buff. So we end up in Palau, a very small country above Papua New Guinea. And he gets in a day before me, and I said, 'Okay, this is the hotel; it's a very small country – you'll find the place. I have everything set.' So I get in the next day and I'm saying, 'Where's Senator Kahele?' They said, 'Oh, he checked in, but he went with somebody and he went to Peleliu.' Peleliu is a two-and-a-half-hour boat ride away, and I was utterly stunned. I said, 'How did he ...?' And they said, 'Oh, he met somebody, was talking to them. They offered to take him on the boat to Peleliu.' He went there, spent the day, came back the next day. And I said, okay, when he came back, you know, it's sort of like when you're missing your kupuna, you're saying, 'What happened? Where did they go?' I said, 'How did you do this?' He said, 'I wanted to see Peleliu. I've always wanted to go to where this battle happened, and I met somebody who said they would take me, and they took me and I went.' That was Senator Kahele: He found a way; he found a way to make it happen.

"So we will always remember Senator Kahele as a great senator, a great father, a great grandfather, a great person. Mr. President, I'd like to request that the Senate adjourn today on a rising vote and observe a moment of silence in honor and memory of Senator Gilbert Kahele."

Senator Galuteria rose and stated:

"Thank you, Mr. President. Let us conclude our tribute to the good senator from Hilo with a mele, a song that embodies his 'ano, or his spirit. And if there ever was an offering that the 'ohana would want to share with us, this would be that makana. Let us embrace the poetry – it would appear it was written exclusively for Gil – and wish him love and aloha, and thank Akua that we could share in the life of this great Hawaiian man."

At this time, the members and guests listened to "Great Hawaiian Man" by Brother Noland Conjugacion as it played in the Senate Chamber.

The Chair stated:

"Kai, thank you for coming down yesterday and sharing with all of us the song that you felt embodied your dad. And to Brother Noland, who said it a lot better than any of us could say right now; we truly appreciate his words and his music."

The Chair then made the following announcement:

"The Senate Chamber will be open this afternoon immediately following session until 5:00 p.m., and again tomorrow from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for members of the public who wish to pay their respects to Senator Kahele. There will be a guest book that the public is welcome to sign and express their condolences to the Kahele family."
