Wednesday, February 3, 2016

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2016, convened at 11:39 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Shimabukuro who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Eighth Day.

At this time, Senator Dela Cruz recognized a group of students from Hallym University in Gangwon, Korea, who were seated in the Senate Chamber. He noted that Hallym University was established in 1982, and had a number of international partnerships, including a foreign exchange program with the University of Hawai'i – West O'ahu, of which the students were participants.

Senator Kidani remarked that the four-week exchange program consisted of English language learner classes, cultural exposure, and job shadowing, including a two-week experience at the State Capitol. She then introduced Kyung Goo Han, a sophomore majoring in pre-medical science who enjoyed snorkeling, surfing, and the local foods of Hawai'i, and thanked him for his help in her office.

Senator Dela Cruz then recognized additional exchange students who were seated in the Senate Chamber: Hyun Kyung Cho, a junior majoring in finance; Ji Yoon Jung, a junior majoring in public administration; Hye Sun Kim, a junior majoring in finance; and Ji Hyun Park, a freshman majoring in journalism.
