

## THIRTY-FOURTH DAY

Tuesday, March 22, 2016

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2016, convened at 11:40 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Galuteria, Harimoto, Kahele, and Riviere who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Third Day.

At this time, Senator Espero welcomed a group of sixth-grade students from Holomua Elementary School, who were seated in the gallery with their teacher and former staff member of Senator Kidani's office, Will Kane, and parent chaperone Rianna Gamboa.

Senator Kidani, on behalf of Senate President Kouchi, introduced Taylor Kishinami, a freshman at 'Iolani School who was serving as an intern in Senate President Kouchi's office.

Senator Baker commended and honored the American Diabetes Association, and presented the following remarks:

"Thank you, Mr. President. Colleagues, this is the American Diabetes Association's yearly Alert Day, in keeping with the health theme established by our inspirational opening speaker. Alert Day is the fourth Tuesday of March; it's a program that the American Diabetes Association uses to raise awareness for personal risk factors for diabetes, and it gives me great pleasure to recognize our local chapter of the American Diabetes Association.

"Some of you may not know, but nearly 600,000 people in Hawai'i live with diabetes or prediabetes, a statistic that translates to approximately one in every three residents statewide. The American Diabetes Association has made significant strides to better outcomes and increase education and access to resources for those affected by this disease, and in doing so, has really made a tangible, positive impact on health across Hawai'i nei. As an example, their research has resulted in increased focus on preventative efforts centered on at-risk populations. Through local mission-critical work, community outreach, and a network of deeply committed volunteers, they have confronted the diabetes crisis head-on, and their dedicated work is certainly worthy of commendation.

"As part of Alert Day, the Hawaii Diabetes Association will be in room 329 from 12:30 p.m. to 2:00 p.m., offering educational resources and information on increasing your individual risk of diabetes. I hope everyone will educate themselves about their risk for type 2 diabetes in order to help improve their health and the health of our state. It's now my pleasure to yield the floor to our doctor in the house, Senator Josh Green, who will be introducing representatives from the Hawaii Diabetes Association."

Senator Green rose to present the following remarks:

"Thank you, Senator Baker. Mr. President, colleagues, there are many ways in which the Hawaii Diabetes Association helps our community, but without their dedicated individuals who lead the organization, they certainly wouldn't have the same success they have today. Today it's my great pleasure to introduce some of those key leaders: First, Dr. Dee-Ann Carpenter, internal medicine at JABSOM Department of Native Hawaiian Health and immediate past president of the American Diabetes Association Hawai'i Community Leadership Board – congratulations; Jane Kadohiro, president and CEO of the Diabetes Education and Support Consulting Services and past

president of the American Diabetes Association Hawai'i Community Leadership Board – congratulations, Jane; Gino Soquena, government and community relations director and American Diabetes Hawai'i Community Leadership Board member as well – thank you, Gino; Laurie Tom, who's an endocrinologist and past president of the American Diabetes Association Hawai'i Community Leadership team's board as well – thank you, Dr. Tom; and finally, Michael Chae, who's the regional director of Northern California and Hawai'i. These are wonderful people; let's give them all another round of applause."
