Monday, January 30, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:31 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator Shimabukuro introduced DeMont and Rachel Conner, constituents from Nānākuli who actively participate in the legislative process, who were seated in the gallery.
