I also want to thank Sergeant-at-Arms and all of their staff for helping us with the flow, making sure that the TV was there, there was an overflow room – people could be engaged in the conversation even if they weren't in the hearing room. And, of course, my staff, who processed an awful lot of testimony, got it on the OneNote and was there to assist as well. So, it does truly take a team effort, and I just want to acknowledge our wonderful staff and their organizational ability, their being able to manage what could have been a very contentious hearing. And I also want to thank Jill Kuramoto, who helps us with PR. I had wanted to keep the media as far away from us as we could to accommodate more of the public. With her help we were able to strike a balance and we got the media in so they could take their notes and get their pictures, and I think it was a win-win for everybody. So, if we ever have another 'hot button' bill hearing in the future we now have our processes and procedures for handling such a hearing, tested – we are prepared. Thank everyone very much."

The Chair stated:

"If it's all right, Chair Baker, I would just add two other notes. The public was very respectful in the way that they came out and expressed their opinion, and I know we've been commenting statewide how some of these meetings have been more contentious with lack of respect, and so, for those who testified and participated, they were great. The other group I'd like to express my thanks to – and I had a chance to talk to them this morning – is the sheriff department. They were available if we needed the assistance, but I appreciated the fact that they quickly recognized that that would not be necessary, and they watched from a safe distance to make sure that they were part of the solution and not escalating anything in the room, and so, for their professionalism, I certainly want to express my thanks."
