

TWENTIETH DAY

Friday, February 17, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:32 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Nineteenth Day.

At this time, Senator English introduced Senator William Castro, member of the 34th Guam Legislature, who was present in the gallery. Senator English highlighted Senator Castro's educational and professional accomplishments and community involvement, and noted that his work in the legislature focused on increasing access to health care and the protection of Guam's natural resources.

Senator Rhoads welcomed the following group of constituents who were seated in the gallery: Winnie Law, Heather Law, Andy Stenz, Gail Tagashira, Maria Carpio, Dale White, Peter Wong, Susan Wong, Ben Carroll, and Linda Carroll.

Senator Ruderman commended and congratulated the Friends of the Library awardees, and presented the following remarks:

"It's my honor today to recognize Ms. Carleen Corpuz on the floor today as the recipient of the 2016 Excellence in Service Award given by the Friends of the Library of Hawai'i. She began her career at Hilo Public Library as a library assistant in 1980, and after many years of dedicated work and promotions became the branch manager and librarian at Mountain View Public and School Library in my district. Mountain View is one of the most economically challenged areas in our state; services such as the public library are especially needed and appreciated. We're fortunate to have her in our community and are extremely grateful for her service to Mountain View.

"In the gallery joining us from the Big Island today is her family: husband Dado Corpuz, sister Marilyn Ah Heong, sister Susan Pau, and cousin Janice Arakaki. Congratulations to Carleen Corpuz. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Harimoto rose to present the following remarks:

"For the past 20 years, the Friends of the Library of Hawai'i has recognized excellence in service for Hawai'i's librarians through the prestigious Librarian of the Year Award. This honor is presented each year to an outstanding librarian who embodies the qualities of dedication, enthusiasm, and excellence in providing library services to their community. This year, in recognition of her outstanding service, the Friends of the Library of Hawai'i's 2016 Librarian of the Year is Vicky Bowie. Vicky Bowie has served Hawai'i's communities through its public libraries for the past 11 years. In 2005, she began as a librarian at the McCully-Moiliili Public Library then moved to the Ewa Beach Public and School Library. She later became the children's librarian at the Pearl City Public Library, where she was promoted to branch manager in 2011.

"Vicky and her staff worked hard to make the Pearl City Public Library a vibrant community gathering place that serves 37,000 registered library card users in the Pearl City area. As a regional library, the Pearl City Public Library is a hub of activity, with an average annual circulation of over 200,000 items per year, more than 23,000 Internet sessions recorded, and host to numerous library programs serving our keiki to kūpuna, such as Tablet Tuesdays, Lego clubs for children, and computer classes for kūpuna. In order to ensure that visitors feel welcome

and comfortable, Vicky coordinated various library construction improvement projects, including renovating and reopening the library's meeting room for public use.

"Now, therefore, the Senate hereby congratulates Vicky Bowie upon her selection as the 2016 Librarian of the Year and expresses our gratitude for her caring and dedicated service. Congratulations, Vicky. And joining us today in the gallery to support Vicky, we have some very important people from the library: Keith Fujio, special assistant to the state librarian; Stacy Kaneshige, public libraries branch director; Paul Mark, the library's communications and official photographer; Sally Morgan from the Friends of the Library; and Kelsey Poaha, Friends of Pearl City Library president. So will you all please stand and be recognized? Thank you. Congratulations, Vicky."
