

## TWENTY-SIXTH DAY

Thursday, March 9, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:30 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Harimoto welcomed a group of 70 students from Pearl City Highlands Elementary School, who were present in the gallery with parent chaperones and their teachers Mrs. Mizuuchi, Mr. Matsuura, and Ms. Yamaguchi.

Senator Galuteria recognized his grandson, Lincoln Lanakila Soares, who was among the students present in the gallery.

Senator Gabbard honored and commended MA'O Organic Farms, and presented the following remarks:

"Good morning, Mr. President, colleagues, our visitors in the gallery. Mala 'Ai 'Ōpio Community Food Systems Initiative, or MA'O, was established in 2001 to recognize our land and youth as our most important assets and to catalyze educational and entrepreneurial opportunities around these assets. MA'O is an acronym for *mala* (garden), *'ai* (food), *'ōpio* (youth) – or 'youth food garden' – and affirms our belief that when we reconnect and restore the relationship between the land and the people, we are able to return abundance and prosperity to youth, to their families, and to the community.

"MA'O Farms is a 23-acre certified-organic farm based in Wai'anae that trains new farmers and community leaders by having them co-manage the operations as they produce, process, market, and distribute a diverse array of high-quality, organic fruits and vegetables. MA'O Farms is improving local food security as well as the economic and social situation of this marginalized community. At MA'O, young people aged 18 to 25 are invited to become involved in an internship, where they work three days a week and go to college two days a week. MA'O Farms pays for their tuition and also gives them a \$500-a-month stipend to work on the farm. MA'O's goal is to bring in young people from the community, make them work hard, compensate them fairly, and let them see that agriculture is a viable career option. At the end of the program, the interns can do more than just work on a farm; they can run the whole operation from the sales and marketing all the way to the fundamentals of land prep and clearing. MA'O Farms's website beautifully explains their mission, and I quote:

Our efforts toward a just, healthy, sustainable, and resilient community food system is envisioned to be community gathering places where love, respect, and a willingness to work is practiced daily. As a teaching and learning farm, MA'O will adhere to its Hawaiian cultural values to aloha 'āina, to care and nurture the land in perpetuity to grow, process, package, prepare, and share food in ways that are pono, sustainable, and just. Our commitment to gather, engage, and empower youth, families, and community in place is of utmost importance to our success, so we will ensure that our work reflects and manifest our values and guiding principles to mālama kuleana – our responsibility to care for our beloved 'āina and our beloved people.

"So I'd now like to allow my colleague from Wai'anae to say a few words."

Senator Shimabukuro rose to present the following remarks:

"Thank you so much. I'm very proud that my district hosts MA'O Farms, which is producing healthy organic foods and

also helps in creating our next generation of leaders. There have been a lot of nice things said about their work; I want to share a couple more gems. Local award-winning and top-selling singer-songwriter Jack Johnson had this to say in *Time* magazine about them:

MA'O Farms is one of the most inspirational places in Hawai'i. Not only are they growing organic produce in a state that ships in 90 percent of its food, they are growing Hawai'i's future by putting youth from Wai'anae Coast through college.

"MA'O's most famous visitor was none other than former First Lady Michelle Obama, who paid a visit to MA'O and spent an afternoon touring the farm and talking story with the interns in November 2011. Mrs. Obama recognized MA'O Farms as a successful model for increasing awareness of and access to healthy eating options and had this to say about them:

We feel like we're just a small part of what you all have been doing for a very long time, and it's important to know that it's working. It's sustaining a community; it's creating conversation, and it's putting young people to work and giving them futures, which is the most powerful thing.

"My ties to MA'O run deep: My sister met her husband through MA'O; I had a life-changing trip to Aotearoa through MA'O. So, from the bottom of my heart, mahalo to MA'O for their incredibly important work for our community and the 'āina. I now want to turn it back over to Senator Gabbard."

Senator Gabbard rose and stated:

"Thank you, Mr. President. First is Gary Maunakea-Forth, the co-founder and farm operations director; next is Kukui Maunakea-Forth, co-founder and executive director; Kamuela Enos is the social enterprises director; Derrik Parker, farm co-manager; Cheyanne Teixeira, farm co-manager; and Taylor Freitas, farm co-manager – please give them a hand. I first met Gary and Kukui when I was on the City Council between 2003 and 2005. I was impressed then with their vision, and I was even more impressed when I did a site visit this past December and Kamuela gave me a tour and an update. During that time, I spoke with some of the students who arrived for work while it's still dark, and they used headlights around their head to harvest the salad greens that are destined for the Four Seasons hotel and other hotels and businesses. I heard and felt the passion in their voices and hearts about doing something good for their families and doing something positive for their community, to counter the bad rap the Wai'anae Coast sometimes gets in the media and elsewhere.

"Ladies and gentlemen, the average age of our farmers in this state is 61, and we're currently importing 90 percent of our food at a cost of around \$3 billion every year. In my humble opinion, who you are looking at today is the future of agriculture in Hawai'i. It's my sincere hope and dream that we replicate MA'O Farms on each of the islands in Hawai'i nei – I'll continue to champion policies that can support making this a reality. So mahalo to MA'O Farms for teaching our youth the value of aloha, respect, and the willingness to work hard. Mahalo for connecting two of our most precious assets: our 'āina, that which feeds, and our 'ōpio, our youth. Your efforts are empowering our community to move forward toward self-sufficiency; mahalo and aloha."

Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Yesterday, we celebrated the International Women's Day. It officially began in New York City in 1909. This day gives us an opportunity to pause and reflect on the role and treatment of

women throughout our world. Women have made great strides since 1909, yet there is a much further race to run. Part of the strides we have yet to make are the ways in which we address domestic violence. In 2004, the Joyful Heart Foundation was created to be a part of the solution in creating a world free of sex assault, domestic violence, and child abuse. To honor that mission today, on all of our desks and those of our colleagues in the House, there are lapel pins, which I have – it's a teal circle with a hole in the middle – to represent that we're part of the Joyful Heart Foundation 'Say NO MORE' campaign. Along with these pins, I distributed cards that give you an opportunity to print a message on it. Mine says, 'No more bullying,' and for those of you who are willing to participate after we take this wonderful picture with MA'Ō Farms representatives, we will be taking one with our signs that we can post to show that the Hawai'i Senate is participating in the NO MORE campaign. Mahalo."

At 11:42 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

At 11:59 a.m., on motion by Senator Espero, seconded by Senator English and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 a.m., Friday, March 10, 2017, on a rising vote, observing a moment of silence in honor and in memory of retired Chief Judge of the Intermediate Court of Appeals James Burns.

At this time, the Chair made the following statement:

The Chair continued:

“In conjunction with our 55 years of Statehood anniversary in 2014, we presented a very special lapel pin to current and past members of the Senate. This pin is a symbol of a member’s service in the Senate and to the people of the State of Hawai‘i.

“Pursuant to Senate Rule 91, the Senate pin shall only be worn by current or past members to whom it is presented.

“Senators Kahele, Chang, and Rhoads, on behalf of the Senate, thank you for your service.”

At this time, Senator Kim presented Senator Kahele with the Senate pin, Senator Kidani presented Senator Chang with the Senate pin, and Senator English presented Senator Rhoads with the Senate pin.
