Thursday, March 23, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Harimoto introduced his brother, Dr. Deane Harimoto, who was visiting from Michigan to celebrate their parents' seventieth wedding anniversary. Dr. Harimoto was seated in the gallery with his wife, Dawn, and son, Alex.

Senator Kidani commended and congratulated Roosevelt High School LifeSmarts State Champions, and presented the following remarks:

"This morning, our Education Week presentations conclude with a team of students from Roosevelt High School that has distinguished itself by winning the statewide LifeSmarts competition last month. For the introductions, Senator Taniguchi, please."

Senator Taniguchi rose to present the following remarks:

"On February 11, 2017, Roosevelt High School's LifeSmarts team emerged as the state champions in the 13th annual LifeSmarts Hawaii competition. They will now go on to represent Hawaii at the national LifeSmarts competition in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, from April 21st to 24th. LifeSmarts is a consumer literacy competition. Students compete in the following categories: personal finance, health and safety, the environment, technology, and consumer rights and responsibilities. After testing their skills through written tests, a 'Speed Smarts' activity, and game-show-style buzzer rounds at the state finals, the team from Roosevelt High School emerged as this year's state champion.

"LifeSmarts is a program of the National Consumers League and run locally by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Office of the Securities Commissioner in partnership with the Hawaii Credit Union League. As a proud alumnus of Roosevelt, I'm very happy to introduce and congratulate the 2017 LifeSmarts team champions. Here today with us on the floor are four members of the team: Zeheng Huang, Hajin Jang, William Li, and Elvis Tran. Captain Bryan Kitsu and coach Brian Lock could not be here to join us today, but sitting with the team is DCCA's LifeSmarts coordinator, Theresa Kong Kee. In the gallery, we also have a few guests: DCCA director Cat Awakuni Colón, who's also a Roosevelt grad; acting commissioner of securities Henry Tanji; Roosevelt High School principal Mr. Sean Wong; LifeSmarts program assistant Ariana Masuoka; program partner Hawaii Credit Union League business services manager Grant Kashiwabara; and one of the program sponsors, UPW Local 646, Florence Kong Kee, representing Dayton Nakanelua."

Senator Kidani rose and stated:

"Mr. President, recognizing these LifeSmarts students is an excellent way to wrap up our Education Week presentations. That's the goal, right? Smart students, equipped to deal with life in their times. The students, teachers, and campus leaders we acknowledged this week are wonderful evidence that we are in good hands. Our obligation as lawmakers is to make sure that they have our support and the right tools to nurture student success in up-to-date and well-equipped surroundings. We need to keep this in mind as we proceed with our work.

"Mr. President and colleagues, I hope you all enjoyed this Education Week, recognizing our students, teachers, principals, and vice principals and schools. I know you all appreciate the amount of hard work that goes into the preparation; for that, I want to recognize Jim Manke of my staff, who did all of the legwork to make Education Week happen. Thank you. Mahalo, Mr. President and colleagues, for your participation in our presentations."
