

THIRTY-SEVENTH DAY

Friday, March 24, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:43 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Galuteria, Kim, and Ruderman who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator Rhoads welcomed Debbie Higgins, his longtime friend who was visiting from southern California. Senator Rhoads noted that Ms. Higgins was an English literature professor, and spent time as the warden at The C.S. Lewis Study Centre at The Kilns, C.S. Lewis's former home in Oxford. Accompanying Ms. Higgins in the gallery was Cindy McMillan, Senator Rhoads's wife and favorite constituent.

Senator Baker noted that it was World Tuberculosis Day and recognized guests from Lanakila Health Center, who were at the State Capitol to raise awareness about the disease.

Senator Keith-Agaran introduced Margie Tupper, a teacher at Nu'uauu Elementary School and mother of his legislative aide, Manuokalani Tupper, both of whom were seated in the gallery.

Senator Espero welcomed a group of sixth-grade students from Holomua Elementary School in 'Ewa Beach, who were present in the gallery with teacher Will Kane and parent chaperones Melanie Natividad and Chandelle Toigoe.

Senator Inouye recognized the presence of Blaine Miyasato from Hawaiian Airlines in the gallery.

Senator Espero celebrated the inaugural Honolulu Biennial Festival, and presented the following remarks:

"I would like to begin by introducing the following individuals affiliated with the Honolulu Biennial arts festival: co-founder Katherine Anne Leilani Tuider; co-founder Isabella Hughes; vice president of the board Gloria Lau; board member Taiji Terasaki; curator Ngahiraka Mason; and board member Li Lundin. Give them a hand, everyone. I have a few words, Mr. President.

"Entwined in art is a reflection of the world around us, capturing both its beauty and despair. The Honolulu Biennial Foundation, through its inaugural Honolulu Biennial arts festival, seeks to link the hearts and minds of the Pacific with presentations and exhibitions of contemporary art highlighting the cultural diversity and common understanding that emboldens the human spirit and the meaning of aloha. Founded in 2014 by Dr. Kóan Jeff Baysa, Isabella Hughes, and Katherine Tuider, the Honolulu Biennial Foundation worked diligently to bring contemporary art to the forefront, further demonstrating our state's growing reputation as an international crossroads for culture, entertainment, and the arts. The community-based, non-commercial exhibition offers complimentary public programs throughout the duration of the eight-week festival. The central exhibition area is located at The Hub at Ward Village, which is the old Sports Authority. Additional exhibition sites include Bishop Museum; Foster Botanical Garden; Hawaii Prince Hotel; Honolulu Hale; Honolulu Museum of Art; the IBM Building at Ward Village; The ARTS at Marks Garage; and Shangri La, a museum of Islamic art, culture, and design. I encourage each and every one of my colleagues to visit these sites to see the contemporary works from 33 artists curated under the direction of Fumio Nanjo, director of Tokyo's Mori Art Museum, and Ngahiraka Mason, former curator of the

indigenous and Maori art at Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki, the largest museum in New Zealand. And we are planning a day where we can have our colleagues in the Senate and in the House visit with staff in the very near future – pau hana, after work.

"Some of the international artists include Brett Graham of New Zealand, Choi Jeong Hwa of Korea, Mohammed Kazem of the United Arab Emirates, Alexander Lee of Tahiti, and Zhan Wang of China. Hawai'i artists include Andrew Binkley, Marques Hanalei Marzan, and Al Lagunero. Our own local artists will benefit from the exposure and publicity of this international art festival, which we know will become a regular event every two years. Our local artists' participation will build and grow Hawai'i's art industry and enhance tourism as well. Pablo Picasso said, 'There are painters who transform the sun to a yellow spot, but there are others who, with the help of their art and their intelligence, transform a yellow spot into the sun.' For those of you who are able to visit these impressive exhibitions at the Honolulu Biennial, you will go from understanding the meaning of Picasso to seeing and feeling its meaning.

"Thank you, Mr. President, for allowing us to share our support for our Hawai'i art industry and helping to promote creativity and innovation globally. We did support and pass a GIA for this endeavor as well, so the State of Hawai'i certainly has skin in this game. And at this time, I'd like to introduce a few people in the gallery: Leila Hughes, the mother of Isabella; Harrison, her husband; and their children, Koa and Roya. And again, one more hand for the Honolulu Biennial inaugural event. Thank you very much, Mr. President."

At 11:52 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

At this time, Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Mr. President, your Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health heard governor's messages totaling about 25 this morning. There were some great nominees, and

our boards and commissions, particularly in the Department of Health, will be the richer for it in terms of the work and goodwill that these nominees will bring. Unfortunately for your Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health, we still have about 40 positions to professional and vocational licensing boards and commissions that are very important to our state, many of whom are in jeopardy of not having quorum if nominees don't come down and we have an opportunity to vet them. So, I would just note for our friends upstairs that there are only four more session days in which to receive boards and commissions nominations, particularly the critical PVL ones. Mahalo."

Senator Inouye rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Okay, we got the results of our contest today and, as you all know, members, we did have the list that would include 29 names. Third place, tie: 27 went to Senator Dela Cruz and Senator Thielen; second place: 28 – Senator Rhoads; and the first place, with complete 29 names: Senator Chang! So, his ears were sharp. Clerk's Office: Allison – she did a good job. Congratulations. Thank you."

The Chair commented, in good humor, that the results were in favor of the younger people in the Senate Chamber, having the skills needed to succeed at the activity.

Senator Green rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Just very briefly: I think that a lot of you have noticed that I've been focusing on some of the health economics of homelessness this year, and I wanted to give a fact and do this maybe over the course of the next couple weeks. Today's fact is that there's a gentleman in our state, a wonderful person who I've been able to meet, who is homeless. He, last year, went to the hospital 241 times, and his healthcare spend, his Medicaid spend – and he shared this openly with us – was \$1,229,570. Some of the proposals that we are working on show that if we get housing for individuals who have chronic homelessness, their healthcare spend drops 43 percent in Hawai'i, 55 percent in other states, which means that this gentleman – named Gary – we would save, if we were able to get him a home, \$528,715, and that's just data from last year. So, as we begin to unfold policy on this and work on this issue, I think, I want to be able to make very clear that this will be good for Gary and good for our state. Thank you, members."
