THIRTY-EIGHTH DAY

Tuesday, March 28, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator English who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Seventh Day.

At this time, Senator Ihara welcomed a group of fifth-grade students from Saint Louis School, who were present in the gallery with teachers Brittany Souza and Brigitte Bolos, and chaperones Mr. Madrid, Mrs. Milford, Mrs. Manipon, Mrs. Hsiung, and Mr. Smith.

Senator Dela Cruz recognized a group of sixth-grade students from Abundant Life School in Wahiawā, who were seated in the gallery with their teacher, Krista Wasson.

Senator Gabbard introduced friends from his previous work in American Samoa: Bill Saleebey, a noted author and public speaker from southern California, and Dan Lyman from Pūpūkea. The visitors were accompanied in the gallery by Senator Gabbard's wife of 48 years, Carol.

Senator Baker noted it was the American Diabetes Association's 29th Annual Alert Day, the fourth Tuesday in March each year, with a theme of "Take A Minute," to remind the public to take a minute for the diabetes risk test. Senator Baker shared that in Hawai'i, 150,000 people have diabetes and 442,000 people have pre-diabetes, and that detecting pre-diabetes helps to encourage individuals to incorporate the necessary lifestyle changes that will ultimately lower risk and delay the onset of diabetes. Senator Baker then introduced American Diabetes Association Hawaii Community Leadership Board members Gino Soquena and Wendy Loh, and American Diabetes Association Hawai'i office staff member Lawrence Duenas, who were present in the gallery.

Senator Galuteria recognized Dante Carpenter, former State Senator and former Mayor of the County of Hawai'i, in the gallery.

H.B. No. 279, H.D. 1, S.D. 1:

On motion by Senator Keith-Agaran, seconded by Senator Rhoads and carried, H.B. No. 279, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

At this time, Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"As grateful as all of our Senate committees are that we are continuing to receive governor's messages with nominations to very important boards and commissions, I would note that there are only three more days left to receive governor's messages with those nominations. There are still many outstanding vacancies for many of the professional and vocational licensing boards that really do an important, critical job. All of our boards and commissions deserve to be fully constituted with qualified individuals. Hopefully, our friends on the fifth floor will be getting more of those down before Friday. Mahalo."

Senator Kidani rose to request that the remarks of the previous speaker be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair so ordered (by reference only).

Senator Nishihara, Chair of the Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and Military Affairs, rose to request a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for the following measures: S.C.R. No. 63, S.R. No. 21, S.C.R. No. 73, and S.R. No. 28.

Senator Nishihara noted:

"S.C.R. 63 requests the Office of Aerospace Development to facilitate the formation of a Multinational Lunar Architecture Alliance to guide the development and implementation of a prototype lunar base on the island of Hawai'i, and S.C.R. 73 requests the Office of Aerospace Development to establish the Multinational Lunar Architecture Alliance. Both of these were not able to be heard in the required time, so we're requesting the waiver."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Nishihara then announced that the Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and Military Affairs and Committee on Economic Development, Tourism, and Technology would be holding a joint public hearing on the measures on Wednesday, March 29, 2017, at 2:45 p.m. in Conference Room 414.
