## Friday, April 7, 2017

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 11:58 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator English who was excused.

## ORDER OF THE DAY

### THIRD READING

#### MATTER DEFERRED FROM THURSDAY, APRIL 6, 2017

H.B. No. 100, H.D. 1, S.D. 1:

Senator Tokuda moved that H.B. No. 100, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator Dela Cruz.

Senator Dela Cruz rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to acknowledge the Ways and Means chair, the Ways and Means committee and staff, and the CIP analyst and my office staff for their invaluable insight, dedication, and hard work.

"Capital improvements play a pivotal role in building the future of our State. The governor proposed a budget of \$1,490,000,000, the House proposed a budget of

\$1,090,000,000, and the Senate proposed a budget of \$999,000,000 in capital improvement budget projects.

"The Senate draft aligns with many of the initiatives the administration has pledged, including the State's goal of doubling food production, addressing jail overcrowding, decreasing the backlog in affordable housing, and addressing capacity issues and new schools for growing communities.

"The Senate is committed to improving the quality of life of our residents, diversifying our economy, investing in our keiki, and ensuring our safety. Proving this commitment, your Committee worked diligently to address increasing the State's inventory of prime agricultural land, putting an end to the search and debate of a site to replace the Oahu Community Correctional Center, addressing our housing crisis by funding development of both affordable and senior housing, and addressing capacity issues at public schools statewide.

"Mandated by our Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, Article XI, Section 3, the Senate draft includes \$20 million to purchase over 500 acres of agricultural land, which will help to provide long-term leases to local farmers and decrease Hawai'i's dependence on imported food items. The Senate also invested an additional \$25 million in upgrades and improvements to water infrastructure systems and agricultural facilities statewide.

"For the Department of Education, the Senate appropriated almost \$440 million for all projects to the Department, including \$77 million for a new secondary school in Kapolei, and \$63 million for continued construction for a high school in Kīhei. The Senate's total investment in education represents 44 percent of the entire general bond monies appropriated statewide. Also included in this effort is a \$5 million appropriation for a pilot project that will renovate existing classrooms and other support facilities to align with an academy concept, strengthening pathways and supporting pipelines into higher education and future employment opportunities.

"The Senate has made a commitment to address the shortage of affordable housing throughout the State. To this objective, your Committee provided \$25 million for an infusion to the Rental Housing Trust Fund, \$25 million into the Dwelling Unit Revolving Fund, and over \$86 million to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority, which includes \$35 million to fund senior living public housing facilities. The senior living housing project is expected to provide an additional 200 to 250 units to an underserved elderly population.

"Your Committee sought to end the discussion and debate on the prospective jail sites once and for all by solidifying a Hālawā location and providing \$60 million to the Department of Public Safety to begin the process for design of a new jail. Six million dollars was also furnished to the Department of Public Safety to add beds to the current Hālawā facility to bring prisoners on the mainland back home; the \$6 million would be for an environmental impact statement. To this effort, your Committee has also provided \$4 million to relocate Department of Agriculture facilities outside of the Hālawā site to accommodate the jail and the prison sites.

"Finally, your Committee recognizes a growing need for proof-of-concept plans and design to better outline initial CIP project criteria and costs, including stakeholder engagement, applied research, conceptual planning, and design investigation. To this end, your Committee has allotted \$2 million to various departments statewide to better facilitate this process.

"Your Committee carefully scrutinized and reviewed all the requests for funding. We had the very difficult task before us of cutting half a billion dollars from the administration's CIP budget due to the decreased revenue projections. With that in mind, we made an extreme effort to address funding needs

across the State while remaining fiscally prudent and sensitive to the administration, its departments, and the community at large.

“Again, I want to thank the WAM chair, the WAM committee members, the committee staff and all their effort and hard work in helping to execute a sound capital improvements budget. I appreciate their commitment and service to Hawai‘i and its future. Mahalo.”

The Chair thanked the vice chair and his team for their work.

Senator Tokuda rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

“Yesterday, Vice Chair Dela Cruz inadvertently challenged me to be creative with my commentary on our draft budget. So, this could be very daunting, considering the fact that we needed to convey the message and overarching theme behind \$14 billion in fiscal year ‘18 and \$14.3 billion in fiscal ‘19, all means of financing. But I decided that this would be an opportune time for me to reclaim my Seussian position on our Senate floor, since the good senator from Hilo decided to put on a red and white hat for his birthday. So, while I wish I could rhyme my way through this speech, like our general excise tax collections, it would all come out flat, and we would find ourselves staring down the barrel of a \$250 million deficit, just like that not-so-happy day in March when the Council on Revenues decided to lower their projections. So, instead, I give you a speech punctuated by some of Dr. Seuss’s well-known and lesser-known book titles to highlight our Senate draft.

“But before I delve into the details, I need to thank my very amazing team. While they are in no way like the characters from Seuss – *Did I Ever Tell You How Lucky You Are?* – being able to work side by side such dedicated, hard-working, and enthusiastic people gives me hope. They really inspire me, and every day, when I come in, and each night, when I leave, I think to myself, ‘Duckie, you really are quite lucky.’

“I should pause right here and note that half of these books I could not find in the state library, but we really appreciate the fact that we were able to borrow them from our state library, and we were able to provide much of the top priority fundings to our state library system, including \$250,000 in priority health and safety repair and maintenance funds as well as the positions and funding they needed for the Nānākuli library, which I know the senator from Wai‘anae-Nānākuli was in great support of, as well as an outreach specialist for homeless services, but I digress.

“Up in our offices, please help me acknowledge the hard workers who are up there right now being continuous, hardworking public servants: Darlene, Nic, Kate, and Vaughn from my office staff, who do an amazing job holding it all together; as well as our amazing WAM team, who have dedicated countless days, nights, weekends, holidays, you name it – every waking moment, led by our committee chief Calvin Azama, budget chief Sabrina Nasir, bills chief Ben Park, Lee Leonard, Chris Tu, Heather Schultz, Robert Nishimoto, Julian Juarez, Johnathan Say, Dylan Smith, Mark Ogata, Jennifer Song, Christopher Han, Michele Sansone, and Daniel Hironaka. Please help me give them a round of applause – working so hard they wouldn’t come down! I tried to get them down here.

“I’d also like to thank very much my vice chair and his office for all of their hard work on the CIP budget. It’s difficult enough to tackle all of your priorities and try to fit it in under the ceiling that they’re initially given, then to be asked to take it down half a billion dollars to help with our overall financial plan and our budget – that’s extremely significant, and that’s a huge sacrifice. And I truly appreciate all of the help that he was willing to give us, so thank you very much for all that you are willing to do and able to help us with.

“Even before the March Council on Revenues, I couldn’t help but feel like ‘the Grinch who stole Christmas,’ and I felt like everyone looked at me in that way, especially when we began our public informational briefings in January with news that our unfunded pension liability had ballooned from \$9.5 billion to \$12.4 billion, meaning significant and immediate increases in employer contributions would be required. Ultimately, this came down in the form of Governor’s Message 4, following WAM’s public informational briefing with Budget and Finance, DOTAX, and DBEDT to go over the revised financial plan, revenue collections, and the state of the economy after the March COR downgrade. And as a result of our discussion there in our hearing rooms during that hearing to consider more moderate phase-ins for the ERS contribution that would still satisfy rating agencies, we discussed what that phase-in would mean for us. Those phase-ins alone meant over a hundred million dollars, and we also talked about the fact that we would also need to look at Maui Memorial severance payments in the amount of \$30 million. But in talking with them and in bringing and considering a more moderate approach, we were able to save over \$60 million over the life of the biennium. These amounts, over \$130 million, are included in our budget, and I can tell you this was extremely significant. It really was like searching for ‘One Cent, Two Cent, Old Cent, New Cent’ when it came to finding the resources necessary to craft a fiscally prudent budget that still reflected the priority needs of our community.

“The Senate draft of the budget reduced the initial admin request by \$204 million over the biennium and includes over \$5.4 million in reductions through the elimination of old and low-priority-to-fill vacant positions. We also conservatively revised our assumptions for various non-discretionary cost items, such as debt service and fringe benefit requirements, saving over \$23 million over the biennium. Going through a very deliberative process of cutting in order to add, we looked for operational redundancies that could be eliminated, prioritized departments’ core needs, and focused on creating a safety net or buffer for critical services at risk for federal fund reductions, and considered what could be funded via bills currently making their way through conference should resources be made available. Similar to approaches WAM took in the previous biennium, we looked to see where costs could be combined and reduced to encourage efficiencies, and considered appropriately utilizing existing base funds first.

“Knowing our Education and Higher Education chairs’ commitment to ensuring access to a broad range of high-quality, highly effective P-20 educational opportunities and supporting our educators in their mission to teach our children, our goal was to provide the foundation that would boost our students up. *Oh, the Places You’ll Go!* But before they can become high fliers who soar to high heights, our budget includes the basics, like buses, lunch, school maintenance, and lights, which we restored or added over \$15 million to the existing biennium budget. As the home of Patsy Mink, it was important we do right by her and Title IX, which is not just sports, but equal opportunity and one’s basic civil rights in education, so we included over \$4.7 million and 22 full-time positions in both the DOE and throughout the University of Hawai‘i System to move us forward toward compliance.

“Looking *Inside Your Outside*, we then had to address rising healthcare costs, such as providing rebased provider payment rates in the amount of \$2.7 million in fiscal ‘18 and \$7.1 million in fiscal ‘19 for developmental disabilities. We also focused on improving services through CAMHD, and added \$1.3 million in fiscal ‘18 and \$1.6 million in fiscal ‘19 for purchase of service contracts. Continuing to support healthcare services to our Medicaid population, we provided \$9.1 million in fiscal ‘18 and \$39 million in ‘19 for capitation payment increases. And, building on previous budget decisions, we included in our base

\$1.8 million in fiscal '18 and \$4 million in '19 for nursing facility inflation factor. Especially as the critical healthcare access point in our rural communities, we included \$36 million in fiscal '18 and \$34 million in fiscal '19 for HHSC operational subsidies for the regions. We also included \$33.4 million in each year to the Maui Health System and provided \$5 million toward their working capital or operational subsidies for our other regions.

"Like Horton, who heard a Who, the Senate draft continues to recognize that 'a person is a person, no matter how small.' Oftentimes, the most vulnerable in our community feel that they have no voice, so those items we have put and increased in the base ensures that all are able to be heard. We've provided \$3 million in each fiscal year for Rapid Re-Housing and an additional \$3 million in each fiscal year for Housing First. We provided \$1.5 million in each fiscal year for homeless outreach and \$2.1 million in each fiscal year for public housing and elderly housing. We've continued efforts to support those with severe mental health and substance abuse challenges, providing outreach, counseling, and housing totaling \$1.6 million in each fiscal year.

"I've often felt it a bit auspicious that we have two former DLNR chairs amongst us, almost like we have two little Loraxes. I don't know if they **look** like Loraxes, but often I think they remind us that 'unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing's gonna get better. It's just not.' Like the Lorax, we made a commitment two years ago in Act 84 to base-fund much of the department's core services with general funds, providing them stability going forward. Following through with this promise, we gave \$14 million in each fiscal year for various programs from watershed management to forestry to natural resources and natural area reserves. We also added \$750,000 for each year for rapid 'ōhi'a death response, an additional \$400,000 each year for fire protection, and \$250,000 each year for watershed protection partnerships. With an admin bill currently moving through the Legislature to reassign HISC to the Department of Ag, we provided \$4 million in fiscal year '18 with the intention that in fiscal '19, funding should be provided to the appropriate agency. While their self-sufficiency efforts continue, we provided 15 positions and \$1 million in each fiscal year for the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission. And, an ongoing priority and concern of the Senate, we included over \$1.7 million in positions and funding for pesticide studies and regulations.

"The highlights I've mentioned reflect a few of the fundamental priorities of our departments and critical needs of our communities. While the dollar amounts may seem significant, I assure you, finding the funding and the resources to fund them was no small task given the financial condition of our state and the ever-increasing fixed costs and unfunded liabilities ahead of us in our future. But thanks to our amazing team, led by our very own Dr. Seuss, Calvin Azama, and his very own Thing 1 and Thing 2, budget and bills chiefs Sabrina and Ben, and their teams, I have the utmost confidence that we will be fine. Going forward into conference, I am reminded of one of my very favorite passages from *Oh, the Places You'll Go!*: 'So be sure when you step, step with care and great tact, and remember that's life a great balancing act. Just never forget to be dexterous and deft. And never mix up your right foot with your left.'

"And finally, Mr. President, as I was looking through the various titles of books, I paused and smiled and just thought of you: *If I Ran the Zoo*. I'm pretty sure, on most days, you feel like you do. Thank you."

The Chair thanked the chair and her team for their work.

Senator Baker rose to speak in strong support of the measure as follows:

"I feel very inadequate with my remarks today because I can't match our masterful speaker who chairs the Ways and Means committee. But I did want to take this occasion to congratulate her team and all who have provided input. With the financial picture being bleak, the budget, of course, cannot reflect all of our wants and desires, but I think the Chair and her team have crafted artfully a measure that addresses many of the urgent needs in our community and helps to move us forward. So, I offer my congratulations to Ways and Means Chair, Committee and staff for the proposal we'll take into conference.

"I'd like to highlight just a couple of things that happen to be near and dear to my heart. First, House Bill 100, Senate Draft 1, for which I stand in strong support, has \$3 million in general funds for the UH Cancer Center. All of you know, as a cancer survivor, I've been very keen on trying to make sure that we keep our NCI-designated Cancer Center because of the research that the Center does and focus it has on our population, and there's no place else in the country – in the world – that can do that as well as we can. The \$3 million that's in the Senate draft will help make up any operating shortfall and will give confidence to the NCI when our Cancer Center is up for the designation review that the Legislature, particularly the Senate, supports the UH Cancer Center. I believe such a demonstration of support will help us maintain this very important designation, because with that designation comes significant federal funding.

"Another area that I'd like to address has to do with the efforts that this budget makes to take care of our kūpuna. Some of you know that, over the years, there have been many efforts going back to the days when Lingle was governor and vetoed a measure that would have instituted our long-term care tax designation to make sure that we had appropriate funds to provide for seniors. Unfortunately, we were not able to override her veto, but we have continued working on ways to make sure that our seniors are provided with the care and services they need. This budget makes sure that those efforts stay on track. The funding provided will help our seniors continue to lead healthy, independent, meaningful, and dignified lives through two important programs: first, the almost \$4 million per year that goes into Kupuna Care – a very successful, very important program of services for our seniors – as well as \$600,000 in general funds for the first fiscal year to help support family caregivers. Our family caregivers should not have to make a choice between working and saving for their own retirement or staying home to help a kupuna family member. By allowing some resources to go to kupuna caregivers, we are ensuring the development of a strong support system for not only our seniors but their caregivers. Also, by appropriating an additional \$1.7 million in each fiscal year for the Aging and Disability Resource Center, this budget ensures that our entire continuum of services throughout the state is robust in supporting our rapidly aging and growing senior population. Because of programs funded in the Senate Draft of the Budget, more and more of our seniors are living longer, healthier, and more productive lives.

"And finally, Mr. President, colleagues, I would be remiss if I did not recognize the excellent work that WAM did to make sure that our community hospitals received the support they need – whether it's an operating subsidy for Kahuku, for HHSC, or for the transition that Maui Memorial Medical Center will be making to Maui Health System, a Kaiser-affiliated hospital. These hospital resources in our community are so important. We cannot exist without the subsidies – at least on the neighbor islands and in the more rural areas of O'ahu. Especially on the neighbor islands, our residents have very limited options. There are very few other alternatives, and our residents on Maui, on Lāna'i, on Kaua'i, and on the Big Island deserve the top-notch

care that is found here on O‘ahu. (I want to note the reason I didn’t include Moloka‘i in the list of neighbor islands is because the hospital on Moloka‘i is affiliated with Queen’s; they’re not part of the HHSC.) Flying everyone from a neighbor island to Honolulu for hospital care is not an option. I’m sure that none of the folks here on O‘ahu would want to have to stand in line for services because the health systems on the neighbor islands failed and everybody was forced to come over here for care. Supporting MMMC’s transition and the other neighbor island hospitals really benefits all of us statewide. I truly appreciate all of the help and support that we found in the Senate to make sure that we have a robust healthcare system for all of us, no matter which island we happen to call home. Mahalo.”
