## Thursday, January 18, 2018

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

### SENATE RESOLUTION

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Offered by: Senators Rhoads, Baker, Green.

At 11:37 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:38 a.m.

At this time, the Chair directed Senator Taniguchi to proceed with a late introduction.

Senator Taniguchi then introduced guests from the National Conference of State Legislatures, who were seated in the gallery: Hawai'i liaison Corina Eckl and National Asian Pacific Americans Caucus staffer Irene Kawanabe.

Senator Shimabukuro invited the members to partake of the haupia that was available in the Majority Caucus Room, courtesy of Leimomi Kahn and the Hawaiian Affairs Caucus. Senator Ruderman rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Last night I attended the Anne Frank exhibition at the East-West Center. It was hosted by Henk Rogers and Maya Soetoro-Ng. It was very moving and I urge all my colleagues to attend if you get a chance. As the child of a man and woman who fled from and then fought the Nazis, this was very close to home for me. One theme we heard was 'Don't be silent! The silence of ordinary people allowed the Holocaust to happen.' Martin Luther King reminded me last weekend: 'We begin to die when we remain silent about important matters.'

"On Saturday, we all got a wake-up call. There's been much discussion since about the alarm, and this discussion is necessary and appropriate, but I am concerned that few are talking about the reason for the alarm, the big picture. The reason we are on hair-trigger alert status, the reason we have a special new alarm system, and the reason we all took it so seriously is the real threat of war, which was not turned off on Saturday. There is more concern for the alarm than for the real danger, which remains unabated! Hawai'i may pay the first price for such a war, but the whole world will be harmed. We seem willing to prepare for a war but not willing to prevent it! (As if there's such a thing as preparing for nuclear war.) We are unnecessarily at the brink of war not with any one nation but with any of a dozen nations. We've been brought to this dangerous place by the childish ravings of one man who is profoundly unfit for the office he holds and who must not be allowed to destroy our country and our planet.

"I call upon our congressional delegation to demand impeachment now for the sake of our safety and the very lives of our children. Only then – only then – can we return to a sense of basic safety. It's absurd to be politely silent in the face of this real and urgent danger. I, for one, will no longer be silent. I hope you will join your voices with me before it's too late. Mahalo."
