

## ELEVENTH DAY

## Friday, February 2, 2018

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Inouye who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Tenth Day.

At this time, Senator Baker thanked the members who were wearing red to participate in Go Red For Women, the American Heart Association's national movement to end heart disease and stroke in women. Senator Baker noted that cardiovascular diseases are the top cause of death for women, and that 80 percent of those diseases can be prevented. She then introduced Mark Yamakawa, board member of the American Heart Association's Hawai'i Division Board of Directors and president and chief executive officer of Hawaii Dental Association; Lani Go-Keala, executive director of the American Heart Association; and Don Weisman, Hawai'i government relations director of the American Heart Association.

Senator Green recognized Anya Maga, who was present in the gallery, and noted that she was the inspiration for Anya's Law, which was passed in 2015.

Senator Thielen introduced Christian Arakawa, an eleventh-grade student at Maryknoll School, who was seated in the gallery. Senator Thielen noted that Christian was serving as an intern in her office that day, and was working on saving the Pali Lanes bowling alley for the windward community of O'ahu.

Senator Chang welcomed a group of third-grade students from Hahaione Elementary School, who were present in the gallery with teachers Julia Chen and Danny Acidera, as well as other teachers and parent chaperones.

Senator Keith-Agaran extended an additional welcome to Danny Acidera, noting that Mr. Acidera grew up on Maui across the street from his mother, and that Mr. Acidera's namesake and aunt, Danielle, works in his office.
