

## FOURTEENTH DAY

## Thursday, February 8, 2018

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Baker welcomed a group of sixth-, seventh-, and eighth-grade students from the Lokelani Intermediate School Student Council, who were seated in the gallery and were visiting O'ahu with teacher Cathy Fitzpatrick and parent chaperones to participate in the USS *Missouri* Digital Media Program.

Senator Kahele recognized 11 members of the Associated Students of the University of Hawai'i Kaua'i Community College Student Government, who were present in the gallery with student life coordinator and staff advisor John Constantino and co-advisor Crystal Cruz.

Senator Galuteria honored and recognized Grammy Award-winning vocalist Peabo Bryson, and presented the following remarks:

"Colleagues, it's my distinct honor to welcome to the Hawai'i State Senate a friend and a premier vocalist in the contemporary music of the world in this last quarter-century: Please welcome Mr. Peabo Bryson. And, Peabo, by the way, thank you so much for doing our contemplation moment, and we thank our senator from Maui for deferring to us today. The words resonated with each one of us, and I'm sure we'll take home the great message. Thank you so much.

"Now, Peabo is a two-time Grammy winner, as we all know, with a beautifully rich operatic voice that survived the passage of time. We were talking in my office before we came down; he's got a beautiful 50-year-old daughter who's going to take care of his 5-week-old baby, so he spans the length of time. In fact, he was saying that she's going to actually be taking care of her 5-week-old uncle? There you go. Obviously, he's a champion of popular culture and music. He's created many duets with a bevy of beautiful and talented women, including Natalie Cole, Roberta Flack, Melissa Manchester, Regina Belle, and Lea Salonga. Beautiful! Peabo enjoyed tremendous success with such musical hits as 'If Ever You're in My Arms Again' – and feel free to chime in any time – 'Can You Stop the Rain,' 'Through the Fire,' 'Unconditional Love.' In 1992 and 1993, Peabo won a Grammy Award for his performance of the song 'Beauty and the Beast' with Celine Dion and 'A Whole New World' with Regina Belle, the theme song for *Aladdin*. Peabo will spend his first public appearance this Valentine season right here in Hawai'i, performing tonight at the Hawaii Convention Center, so on behalf of the Hawai'i State Senate, my friend, we want to extend to you our sincerest appreciation for joining us here today and for your contributions to the music world and your future contributions as well. We wish you the warmest aloha! Thank you so much, and the best in all future endeavors – Mr. Peabo Bryson. Mahalo; thank you so much. And, Mr. President, I'd like to ask for a brief recess so that we can say aloha no to our honored guest.

"We do have special guests who came with Peabo. In the chamber today, joining in is Lara Cuevas – she is a vocalist in his orchestra; Jaymee Rodriguez; Dwight Watkins – that's Peabo's best friend; Andrew and Diana Garcia; and Jennifer Duran of the Love Rocks! concert – they all accompanied Peabo today. Thank you, Mr. President."
