At this time, Senator Wakai, Chair of the Committee on Economic Development, Tourism, and Technology, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for S.B. No. 2751.

Senator Wakai noted:

"This is a fantastic bill; you might actually say it's out of this world. It allows the Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems, or PISCES, to be removed out from underneath OAD and directly attach it to DBEDT."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Wakai announced that the Committee on Higher Education and the Committee on Economic Development, Tourism, and Technology would be holding a joint public hearing on S.B. No. 2751 on Thursday, February 15, 2018, at 1:20 p.m. in Conference Room 414.

Senator Tokuda, Chair of the Committee on Labor, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for S.B. No. 2369, Proposed S.D. 1.

Senator Tokuda noted:

"As a result of information that has come out of recent hearings and a constantly shifting federal landscape, we felt it important to post and hear this measure."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Tokuda announced that the Committee on Labor and the Committee on Judiciary would be holding a joint public hearing on S.B. No. 2369, Proposed S.D. 1, on Thursday, February 15, 2018, at 2:45 p.m. in Conference Room 229.

Senator Baker, Chair of the Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for S.B. No. 2939.

Senator Baker noted:

"This measure would establish some performance incentives and metrics for our electric utilities, and although the request to hear the bill came in late, I think it is a concept that is worth a hearing so we can get it in before lateral. Thank you."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Baker announced that the Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health would be holding a public hearing on S.B. No. 2939 on Thursday, February 15, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Conference Room 229.

Senator Ruderman rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"As we mark one month past since our notorious false alarm on January 13, I want to remind my colleagues that even though the alarm has been turned off, the danger remains. Much has been said and bills proposed to better handle the next alarm; this is understandable and well-intentioned. But, in fact, survival of the next nuclear war is largely a fiction. Any country which launches a nuclear attack is not practicing sanity, but that country knows, tactically, that it has only one chance to launch and the world will end very, very soon. That country won't be sending a measured single weapon; it will unleash its full force at once as its only hope of survival. Considering missile defense systems and assured retaliation, such a state will launch dozens of missiles, and the response will be measured by the sanity and self-control of the leader of the attacked country. God help us if our current leader is still in office. Depending on the size and where they explode, between 10 to 100 nuclear bombs are enough to make our planet unlivable regardless of where those bombs fall. At least aboveground, the atmosphere will be deadly poisonous for years. And, of course, if we are ground zero, no building, law, or preparation will provide meaningful shelter. The only action that will help us survive a nuclear war is preventing it. I urge my colleagues to realize this. Our future and the lives of our children depend on preventing a nuclear war, not preparing for one. Mahalo."
