"This bill (2013) began with a call from a Papaikou constituent. She is completely bedridden. At the point of her original call, her husband had just returned home from the hospital and was receiving hospice care.

"She became acutely aware of her need for a renewed state ID, in order to be able to access their accounts upon his passing.

"In order to get an ID, she would either have to go into the DMV office, or have to get a note from an MD that she was unable to come in to get one. Her Primary MD had recently informed our constituent that she had been removed as a patient since she had not come in for office visits for quite some time. The doctor was also retiring.

"After a number of calls to the Office on Aging at the County and other agencies supporting elderly issues we gave her the name of a doctor that did house calls.

"When she wrote her letter to us a few months later, her husband had passed away. She still had no ID, and even a hospice nurse practitioner offered to write her a note, but the DMV requires a Medical Doctor sign the note.

"Finally, we called Bay Clinic and they were extremely helpful – getting their Chief MD, a nurse, and a health care coordinator to visit. She now has her ID, and a health provider to manage her health care.

"This scenario will be happening more and more, which is why we need to be more flexible and accommodating to the growing number of elderly in our communities. I ask your support on passing this bill through Third Reading."
