Thursday, April 5, 2018

The Senate of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 12:11 p.m. with the President in the Chair.

In other words, there remains private property on which a shoreline protection system might be constructed.

"Each year, we pass additional laws and resolutions calling on government agencies to begin a managed retreat from the eroding shoreline and to prepare for rising sea levels. Unfortunately, we rarely hold ourselves accountable when the tough decisions arrive and we often grant variances that defeat these policies. I understand the desire of the property owners to protect their investment, but they have no right to harden the shoreline on public land, which in this case is the beach. There is still room for them to build a structure on their own property.

"If I expect others to follow our laws and defend our managed retreat policies, I must hold myself to the same standard and make the difficult decisions when required. I must, therefore, vote No on this resolution."

Senator Thielen requested that remarks in support of the measure with reservations be entered into the Journal, and the Chair so ordered.

"While I support this resolution, I recognize the precedent this may set for other applications to harden our shorelines. Therefore I agree with other senators that this resolution may impact other regions of our state.
