

## FIFTEENTH DAY

## Friday, February 8, 2019

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Ihara who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fourteenth Day.

At this time, the Chair publicly acknowledged and thanked Danicia Honda, Senator Kidani's office manager, for her contributions to the community in working with young women from Wai'anae High School to prepare for their prom.

Senator Kahele introduced Kawika Perreira, a tenth-grade student at Saint Louis School, who was accompanied in the gallery by his mother, Dr. Trisha Kehaulani Watson; Dr. Benton Keali'i Pang of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs; and Elmer Ka'ai from the University of Hawai'i.

Senator Keohokalole recognized and honored the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu and the Hawaiian Civic Club movement, and presented the following remarks:

"In the malama of Kaulua and the rising of the Kūlua, this 8th day of February during the 'Ōlelo Hawai'i Month marks the final day of Hawaiian Caucus Week. On Monday, we honored our 'ōpio from Nānākuli Intermediate and High School, and the process they took to fight for water rights. On Tuesday, we honored Joseph Kūhiō Lewis, a single parent raising his children with Hawaiian values. On Wednesday, we honored a kupuna, Auntie Ululani Beirne, for her advocacy in the fight and education on self-determination. And yesterday, we honored an ally, Honpa Hongwanji, for their contributions in the advancement of Native Hawaiians. This month, February, is the month for growing things in the Hawaiian calendar, and together we are planting the seeds to build an 'ahahui—an organization—so that those seeds will help grow our Native Hawaiian lāhui. Mr. President, with your permission, I'd like to yield my time to my fellow colleague from Maui Nui to share further about our 'ahahui."

Senator English rose to present the following remarks:

"The Hawaiian Civic Club movement was the fulfillment of a dream for Prince Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole. As a delegate to the United States Congress, with his concerns over the decline in spirit and devastating spike in the mortality rate of the Native Hawaiian people and the fear that they would not have the educational skills to protect their interests, Prince Kūhiō knew that he needed to plan and grow those grassroots to build an 'ahahui so the seeds would help grow our native lands. Along with the Hawaiian leaders, Prince Kūhiō recognized that Native Hawaiians were going through a very difficult period of adjustment after losing their nation, their lands, and their way of life. Mr. President, with your permission, I yield my time to the colleague from Moku o Keawe, Senator Kahele."

Senator Kahele rose to present the following remarks:

"In 1918, Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole and a group of his cohorts established and organized the Hawaiian Civic Club, now called the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu. The Hawaiian Civic Club was formed with the objective of providing scholarship aid for the education of Hawaiian students; of preserving and promoting the Hawaiian heritage, traditions, language, and culture; of promoting and supporting

organizations interested in improving the lives and conditions of the Hawaiian people and community at large, as well as legislation beneficial to the Hawaiian community. It also advocated for the perpetuation of those values that dignify all human life, which are the moral and ethical foundation of our cultural expressions that comprise a unique, rich, and enduring legacy of the indigenous people of Hawai'i. The Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu was the first of 5 councils and 67 clubs to follow in the Hawaiian Civic Club movement, all working toward the goal of improving the lives for Native Hawaiians. The Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu continues to thrive and serve as a leader within the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs that was created in 1959 to facilitate the goals and objectives of bettering the conditions of Native Hawaiians. Mr. President, with your permission, I yield my time to the senator from the ahupua'a of Wai'anae for the introduction of our individual honorees."

Senator Shimabukuro rose to present the following remarks:

"Our first honoree, Charles Manu'aikohana Boyd, is a kumu hula, songwriter, composer, well-known entertainer, a cultural and protocol advisor, and is currently employed at Kamehameha Schools as their cultural consultant. Manu Boyd is the current pele kikena of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu. Also with him is Hailama Farden, and he is currently the new pele kikena of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs. He currently is the regional director of Kamehameha Schools for Kona O'ahu. He is a leading language and cultural resource to many. Mr. President, with your permission, I yield my time now to the senator from Ko'olaupoko."

Senator Keohokalole rose and stated:

"Colleagues and members of the gallery, can you please help me in congratulating our honorees today? Mahalo. We also would like to extend our best wishes for the success of all our Hawaiian Civic Clubs as they continue their journey in moving our lāhui forward. In the gallery, we have several members of our Hawaiian Civic Clubs here to join us for this special floor presentation. Can all the folks who are joining us today on behalf of the Hawaiian Civic Clubs please stand and be recognized? Thank you."

Senator Dela Cruz acknowledged the presence of City and County of Honolulu Prosecutor Keith Kaneshiro in the gallery.

At 11:47 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:51 a.m.
