

NINETEENTH DAY

Thursday, February 14, 2019

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Eighteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Baker noted that it was Mental Health Awareness Day, an event that highlights mental health as an important public health issue, current prevention and treatment opportunities, the organizations involved in this great work, and how elected officials can promote mental health in Hawai'i. Senator Baker then recognized the following organizations who helped with the event, representatives of which were present in the gallery: Sutter Health Kāhi Mōhala, Mental Health America of Hawai'i, NAMI Hawaii, 'Ohana Health Plan, Hawai'i Health & Harm Reduction Center, and Parents and Children Together.

Senator Kidani recognized The Manhattan Transfer, and presented the following remarks:

"Today, I am so honored to have special guests with us here on the floor. They are none other than The Manhattan Transfer: Trist Curless, Cheryl Bentyne, Alan Paul, and Janis Siegel. Mr. President, the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i welcomes to Hawai'i Grammy award-winning jazz group The Manhattan Transfer and congratulates them on the release of their latest studio album, *The Junction*, along with their recognition by the National Music Council's American Eagle Awards.

"Founded in New York City in 1972—and I know many of us were around and enjoy their music—the iconic jazz vocal group has showcased their tremendous talent in the genres of a cappella, vocalese, swing, standards, Brazilian jazz, rhythm and blues, and pop music. Their dedication to jazz vocal excellence has allowed The Manhattan Transfer to travel worldwide, touring around the globe, singing in harmony and inspiring several generations of listeners. The Manhattan Transfer has experienced immense success throughout the course of their 47-year career, including 20 Grammy award nominations and 10 Grammy wins in the categories of Best Jazz Fusion Performance, Best Pop Vocal Performance, Best Jazz Vocal Performance, and Best Contemporary Jazz Performance. This past summer, the group was honored with the National Music Council's 35th Annual American Eagle Award in recognition of long-term contributions to American musical culture and heritage, music education and inspiration for youth, and the protection of creators' local and global rights.

At this time, Senator Taniguchi, Chair of the Committee on Labor, Culture and the Arts, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for S.B. No. 1394.

Senator Taniguchi noted:

“Senate Bill 1394 proposes to establish an historic preservation income tax credit. Your Committee on Labor, Culture and the Arts heard S.B. 1394 on Tuesday, February 12, and deferred the measure in order to seek a re-referral jointly to LCA/WAM to allow more time to work with the interested parties before First Decking. WAM has advised us that it would accommodate revisions to the bill and asked LCA to hold decision-making to move the bill forward and to avoid a joint hearing.”

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Taniguchi announced that the Committee on Labor, Culture and the Arts would be holding a decision making meeting on S.B. No. 1394 that afternoon at 3:05 p.m. in Conference Room 224.

The Chair called on Senator Gabbard and directed him to lead the members in song to wish Senate Chief Clerk Carol Taniguchi a happy birthday, after which the members rose in applause.

Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“A few days ago, Hawai‘i lost an amazing woman. Not only was she a civil rights advocate, a volunteer for projects and issues that inspired social change, she was a feminist; she was a mother, a grandmother, and a third-generation Korean American here in Hawai‘i. I’m speaking about my dear friend Jacqueline Young—Jackie to all of us.

“I got to know Jackie when we were working with the American Cancer Society, advocating for greater screenings and raising awareness. I also had the good fortune to serve with her when I was in the House of Representatives. She was the first woman who was elected Vice Speaker in the House and served there with distinction. She also has, to her credit, the founding of a domestic violence/spouse abuse shelter on the windward side, and she’s done so many, many other things. But I wanted to take this opportunity to share a little bit about her; I wanted to acknowledge her daughters Paula and Nani in the gallery.

“Jackie just did so many things in our community that we can only say aloha and mahalo nui loa for her dedication, her wonderful life, and for her friendship to so many of us here in the state, working to make sure that equal rights are protected, that civil rights are protected, and that people are uplifted in all that we do. Hawai‘i historian Tom Coffman said about her, ‘Jackie Young is what the public no longer believes exists: An adept politician and a pillar of unwavering conviction.’ That was Jackie, and I know that’s how we will all remember her, so, Mr. President, at the appropriate time, I’d like to request that the Senate adjourn on a rising vote and observe a moment of silence in honor and memory of former Representative Jackie Young. Mahalo.”

Senator Kim rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“I would like to add my thoughts for Jackie as well. As fellow Koreans, we often worked together on a number of issues, and I was really pleased as President to appoint her to the Judicial Selection Commission, and I know she loved serving on the commission. We had many talks about that, and

she was an advocate for them as well as so many others that were mentioned by Senator Baker. And my condolences to her daughters and her family. Mahalo.”

Senator Thielen rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“I’d like to recognize Jackie Young. I moved back to Hawai‘i in 1990 after 12 years of living on the mainland, and I remember going to an event that was sponsored by the Hawai‘i Women’s Political Caucus and the Hawaii Women’s Legal Foundation. Up on the stage, there was this woman who was talking about domestic violence and the need to take action to help victims of domestic violence and the work that she’d done in our community in Kailua to help set up a shelter so there would be a safe place for victims to go, where they could get help. I remember I had lived downstairs from some people where there was violence going on, and I hadn’t really recognized the extent of the problem, but she helped to educate so many of us in the community, and she was just a stalwart representative for women everywhere, and also for the environment. She helped protect the view planes on Olomana to make sure that it wasn’t developed. She helped so many environmental and land use areas on Windward O‘ahu, and we will forever be in her debt. She also was somebody who, when she left public office, continued public service in a lot of quiet and mainly unrecognized ways because she was a dedicated public servant. She was a tremendous role model. I want to thank her daughters for the time that they gave up with her in order that she could do the public work that she did because she really inspired so many of us, and we’re just eternally grateful for what she’s done and the legacy that she’s left in this state. Mahalo, Jackie.”

The Chair remarked:

“I would say, following up on Senator Kim because of her appointment of Jackie to the Judicial Selection Commission, which she eventually was the chair of, I have shared the rostrum with Jackie at the swearing-in of the newly confirmed judges at the Supreme Court, and she has always handled herself with class, with dignity—an articulate spokesperson, and, most importantly, lent the credibility that she brought to the process, and never have any of the senators questioned the Judicial Commission’s selection. We most often commend them on the selections that they have sent forward to the chief justice as well as the governor, and under Jackie’s leadership, we have seen an ability to work with the chief justice and the governor to bring better gender equity to the amount of women who serve on the bench, which I would add to all of the accolades that Senator Thielen talked about. Her legacy—certainly, for me, the first thing I will think about because of my interaction—is her work to bring that gender equity to the bench in the State of Hawai‘i, and I will miss sharing our time together at the swearing-in ceremonies at the court. She was always wonderful to be with.”

Senator Ihara rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“Jackie was Vice Speaker of the House when I was Majority Floor Leader. We had selected our preferred Speaker, and Jackie and I were part of a team to balance with the Speaker and bring much more diversity, and it was a time when I would call it a good-government bloom; we had a whole bunch of reforms. In fact, the Speaker, working with Jackie, we really advanced the Public Access Room and brought a lot of visibility in the community, and Jackie was the spokesperson for that, and the Speaker that year got an unprecedented good-government award from Common Cause, much of it because of Jackie’s work. I’d been to her house a number of times. As a person, I would aspire to be a human being like Jackie, and I really want to honor her and acknowledge her daughters: Thank you for

being here in this sacred place that she was the Vice Speaker of on the other side. Thank you, Mr. President.”

Senator Inouye rose and stated:

“I’d be remiss not to join the rest of my fellow colleagues in honoring Jackie as well, and just to add that Jackie was so involved with many areas that were recorded earlier. But I must add that she attended an event when I was mayor—on behalf of the three women mayors in 1990 who got elected the first time in the State of Hawai‘i—here on O‘ahu where the Hawaii Women Lawyers honored the three women at a forum, and Jackie came up and she was so proud of us three women, and, hopefully, it will continue. However, as Senator Kim and you, Mr. President, mentioned, in her role as chair of the Judicial Selection Commission, she appeared at—I believe it was her last visit to the neighbor islands, in October, when the Selection Commission, under her purview, had appointed and recommended six women judges for Hawai‘i island—the last appointment of the judge in Waimea of Big Island, and she was just ecstatic and proud, and, of course, the chief justice did allow her to speak during that confirmation process as well. But we all understand and share our condolences to the family and, hopefully, we’ll see a lot more Jackie Youngs going forward.”

Senator Inouye then thanked Senator Nishihara for the baked goods on the members’ desks in honor of Valentine’s Day.

The Chair then announced that the deadline to file standing committee reports would be 11:00 p.m. that evening.

At 12:03 p.m., on motion by Senator Kahele, seconded by Senator Fevella and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 a.m., Friday, February 15, 2019, on a rising vote, observing a moment of silence in memory of former State Representative Jacqueline Eurn Hai Young.
