On motion by Senator Kahele, seconded by Senator Fevella and carried, the joint report of the Committees was adopted and S.C.R. On motion by Senator Kahele, seconded by Senator Fevella and carried, the joint report of the Committees was adopted and S.R. No. 121, entitled: "SENATE RESOLUTION URGING ALL APPLICABLE STATE AGENCIES TO WORK TOGETHER WITH INTERESTED STAKEHOLDERS, INCLUDING THE HONOLULU HARBOR USERS GROUP, IN ASSESSING THE RISK OF AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES TO HAWAII, VECTORS, AND POSSIBLE MITIGATIONS, IN PREPARATION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW FEDERAL STANDARDS IN 2022," was adopted.

Senator Rhoads, Chair of the Committee on Judiciary, rose to request a waiver pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for H.B. No. 89, H.D. 2, S.D. 1; and H.B. No. 673, H.D. 2, S.D. 1.

Senator Rhoads noted:

"In order to efficiently meet the deadline for decking, we are requesting that the above measures be added to the April 3rd agenda and the 48-hour notice requirement be waived."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Rhoads announced that the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Ways and Means would be holding a joint decision-making meeting on H.B. No. 89, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, and H.B. No. 673, H.D. 2, S.D. 1 the following morning at 10:00 a.m. in Conference Room 211.

Senator Wakai, Chair of the Committee on Energy, Economic Development, and Tourism, rose to request a waiver pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for H.B. No. 852, H.D. 1, Proposed S.D. 1.

Senator Wakai noted:

"Members, there were some last-minute changes we wanted to make to the bill that will redo, reinvent, and reinvigorate the Office of Energy, and, in order to do that and in order to meet the single referral filing deadline, we are asking for this waiver."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Wakai announced that the Committee on Energy, Economic Development, and Tourism and the Committee on Ways and Means would be holding a joint public hearing on

H.B. No. 852, H.D. 1, Proposed S.D. 1 on Thursday, April 4, 2019, at 10:10 a.m. in Conference Room 211.

Senator Dela Cruz, Chair of the Committee on Ways and Means, rose to request a waiver pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for H.B. No. 348.

Senator Dela Cruz noted:

"It makes appropriations for public employment cost items of and cost adjustments for employees of various legislative agencies. These offices include the State Ethics Commission, Office of the Auditor, Legislative Reference Bureau, Office of the Ombudsman, Senate, and House of Representatives."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Dela Cruz announced that the Committee on Ways and Means would be holding a public hearing on H.B. No. 348 on Thursday, April 4, 2019, at 10:10 a.m. in Conference Room 211.

Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Colleagues, you will note that some of your female colleagues today are wearing their pink kitty-cat hats (cleaning it up because I tried to use the title that the project used when they did these, and ETS would not let me go to that site because they said it was pornography). However, not to be deterred ... Today is Equal Pay Day. It symbolizes the gap from the beginning of the year through that it's going to take us to have women earn the same amount that men earned, so it's a floating date. Since 1980, where women earned 60.2 cents for every dollar that men earned, we are now up to 81 cents in Hawai'i, but that just means that we still have a long way to go. So, colleagues, in honor, I suppose, or with sadness for our Equal Pay Day that we still don't have, some of us are wearing our pink hats as a symbol of how women are still treated in the workplace as an object and not a meaningful participant deserving of equal pay with their male colleagues. Mahalo."

Senator Thielen rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Colleagues, I'd like to put a human face on what the meaning is for the difference in pay for women and men. Two years ago, I talked about how the pay gap exists not on average, but in every single profession, in every single age group, in every single ethnic group, in every single education level, there is a pay gap between women and men. It's not just coincidence, and it's not just limited to a few areas. Last year, I talked about some rising stars in Hawai'i, some high school and young college-age women and what it was going to mean to them, over the course of their lifetimes. Today, I'd like to talk a little bit about what it means to the women in the workforce who are reaching retirement age or who are my age, of a "certain age," and going to be retiring.

"We took a look at some trend information, and the one profession that we could find trend information on for the average salary of women and men were elementary school teachers. The average female elementary school teacher in 1960 was paid \$35,000 a year. The average male elementary school teacher in 1960 was paid about \$45,000 a year. Over the lifetime earnings of these two people, the woman would earn \$400,000 less, meaning \$400,000 less saved up for retirement, \$400,000 less to support her family during her working years. In 1980, average pay for a female elementary school teacher was still around \$35,000. Average male elementary school teacher had risen up to about \$55,000. That's 70 cents on the dollar, \$600,000 over the career less that that woman would earn. Today, when we say that we've made progress and there's 80 cents on the dollar for the women, we still have, on average,



female elementary school teachers earning about \$57,000 a year, male elementary school teachers earning about \$71,000 a year, and, over the lifetime, \$560,000 less.

“It’s not a matter of taking money away from men to have equal pay. It’s a matter of bringing more income into family households; more income for those children, for the women’s spouses, for their parents, to be able to help take care of them; more income for them as they age and go into retirement so there’s less of a burden on the state systems and the social welfare systems. Eighty cents on the dollar is nothing to celebrate. It just means that we have to do a lot, lot more to help these women. Thank you.”

The Chair announced that the leadership meeting originally scheduled for 12:00 p.m. that afternoon would be canceled so that members could attend the joint public hearing of the Committee on Water and Land and the Committee on Ways and Means.
