

FORTY-FIFTH DAY

Thursday, April 4, 2019

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 11:38 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Keith-Agaran, Kidani, and Ruderman who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Fourth Day.

At this time, Senator Baker recognized members of her staff and thanked them for their hard work: committee clerk Heath Williams, legislative aides Alisha Leisek and Loren Navarro, deputy committee clerk for Health Allysen Manding, deputy committee clerk for Consumer Protection Sophia Anderson, University of Hawai'i intern Vendela Lindahl, and nursing student interns Roxanne Haverkort-Yeh and Nicole Ryan.

Senator Gabbard recognized student members of the Hawai'i Association Future Farmers of America (FFA), who were seated in the gallery with their advisors and were gathered on O'ahu to attend their annual state convention. Senator Gabbard noted that they had been a part of Hawai'i's proud agricultural heritage since its founding in 1929, with the mission of making a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth, and career success through agricultural and natural resources education.

The Chair shared that he had met with the FFA students from Kaua'i and that the number of young women who were interested in agriculture was remarkable.

Senator Fevella introduced legislative aide Tristel Tynanes, who was seated in the gallery with her fiancé, Jerome Macalino, and thanked him for his service in the United States Air Force.

Senator Inouye commended David Fuertes, a retired Kohala High School teacher and former managing director for the County of Hawai'i, for his efforts to keep the FFA program alive when funding had been cut in the early 2000s.

The Chair extended an additional welcome to David Fuertes, noting that he was a proud alumnus of Waimea High School on the beautiful island of Kaua'i.

Senator Inouye rose on a point of personal privilege to comment that when she served as mayor, her managing directors for the County of Hawai'i were Kaua'i-born folks.

Senator Kahele welcomed FFA students and their teacher from Kea'au High School, who were seated in the gallery.

Senator Kim introduced her good friend and supporter Shari Berinobis, who was present in the gallery with relatives Mike and Linda Benson.

Senator English congratulated FFA members from Moloka'i and reemphasized that their main focus of discussion that day was deer control on the island of Moloka'i. The FFA students in the gallery included Cameryn Kahalewai, Maria Angst, Ciara Adachi, Kawohi Duvauchelle, Leo Kalipi, Cobra Curtis, Matthew Rowe, and Kalani Aquino; the students were accompanied by advisors Kai Sawyer and David Powell.

Senator Baker acknowledged FFA students from Lahainaluna High School, and noted that in addition to farming, they were learning about leadership skills, and that she expected they would seek elective office on the state and county levels in future years.

Senator Kanuha welcomed students from Konawaena High School, who were present in the gallery with Tina Alcaín.

On behalf of the members of the Senate, the Chair thanked the FFA students for the roses they had delivered that morning.

At 11:48 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
