The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 6:54 p.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Fevella who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifty-Seventh Day.

At this time, Senator Ruderman introduced his daughter, Aviva, and her mother, Dina.

Senator Inouye welcomed the Honoka'a High School Jazz Band, a Grammy-award winning group nominated as a finalist for the Nā Hōkū Hanohano Awards for jazz album of the year. Under the direction of Mr. Gary Washburn, the jazz band was traveling across the state on its annual spring tour, and had performed in the rotunda earlier that evening.

Senator Wakai moved that S.B. No. 1292, S.D. 2, H.D. 3, having been read throughout, pass Final Reading, seconded by Senator English.

Senator Riviere rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

"I rise in opposition, and I stand with the communities who are suffering from the overwhelm of vacation rentals. We have a dire crisis in the state right now, especially in areas that I represent—areas that are very popular with visitors, and they're beautiful places and we want to share them with the visitors, but we need a place to live also. We need residents in our residential communities. There is a giant problem before us in this explosion of alternative accommodations.

"This body has taken a pretty good position the last couple of years. We've put together a comprehensive, well-crafted, honorable bill to address the transient accommodation tax collections with appropriate enforcement mechanisms. In each year, the House has failed to act on that. In fact, this year, we passed over a very good bill: this one. When it left here, it was fine; it came back in a form that's absolutely inadequate. I would note that the House did not appoint conferees; they didn't even want to talk about it. I would point out also that there's House Bill 419 that we modified when it was here to put some enforcement mechanisms in there so that there were a couple of vehicles to address this huge societal shift and problem that it's creating: the homelessness, the high price of rentals and living, the lack of availability of housing. So we passed over a bill, House Bill 419, Senate Draft 2, that had enforcement mechanisms built into it. Once again, the House failed to even appoint any conferees. They're not serious about addressing the problem, and if all this is just a money grab—let's just grab the money and we don't care about the impacts on our societies—I cannot support that. I think it's terrible that there are people doing illegal activity. They should pay the tax: If they're doing the business, they should be paying the tax. But if they're doing illegal activity, we should not then condone that by saying, 'That's okay; just give us the check. Give us the money because we need it.' We have much greater problems with our homelessness and the affordable housing. I mean, we've got 20,000 houses that are now no longer in long-term rentals.

"So I'll leave it there, but the House has failed to act. That is not incumbent upon us to then just cave in and acquiesce to every one of their wishes. We need to be strong; we need to send them a message back; we need to say 'no' to this bill tonight, and then let's pick this up again next year. Thank you."

Senator Wakai rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"Colleagues, each of us understands we don't get everything we want during any legislative session, and, for three years, lawmakers have tried to wrap their arms around transient vacation rentals. I agree, the perfect fix involves two elements: taxation and regulation. The House has been resistant to putting

any responsibilities on the TVRs except to mandate they pay taxes. Year after year, the Senate has been working diligently to put hooks into those platforms, empower the counties, mandate reporting, and force them to take down the bad actors. That call to action has been repeated for three years, but the House is not listening. While state lawmakers engaged in hand-to-hand combat, the counties watched from the sidelines. They cheered us on as the Senate did their dirty work. For the last two weeks, I've been working with the senator from Waimānalo on amendments to House Bill 419. We brought the AGs and the mayors into the discussions; the House refuses to budge.

"A Ninth Circuit court decision in March sided with Santa Monica and determined that the platforms can no longer hide behind the Communications Decency Act or the Stored Communications Act. The removal of that shield paves the way for the counties to do what they should have been doing decades ago. Honolulu is close to setting up a permitting process, finally, for these TVRs. Under S.B. 1292, all operators must register with DOTAX and get a TAT as well as a GET number. There are fines for those who fail to register. It mandates that the Airbnbs and Expedias of the world become tax collectors. They must submit reports to DOTAX. That report will include names, address, tax numbers, and amount of taxes paid. Auditors can check on compliance and go after those who are cheating us of our taxes. DOTAX and the gov's office are supportive of this bill in front of you.

"Opponents say the government won't know if an owner is operating a TVR in violation of the zoning code, but the state is not responsible for enforcing county zoning rules. On page 15 of this measure in front of you, we give the counties the authority to put hooks into the platform. It says, 'Nothing . . . shall be construed to preempt or prohibit the authority of any county or political subdivision of the State, to adopt, monitor, and enforce local land use ordinances, rules, or regulations, nor to transfer the authority to monitor and enforce these ordinances, rules, or regulations away from the counties.' That's all that the counties need to finally do their job.

"Colleagues, when it comes to controlling where and how many TVRs exist, that is not our kuleana. Ours is to collect taxes rightfully due to the state. Opponents are demanding the entire loaf of taxation and regulation, and refuse to accept half a loaf. Half a loaf, I tell you, is better than to starve our state coffers for another year. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Thielen rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

"Most of us in this room are familiar with Rapid 'Ōhi'a Death, the disease that's decimating our native forests, especially on the Big Island. It's sweeping through our forests and it's killing off our native ecosystem, and when the trees die, the native species that live in them, the flora and fauna, all die. We could try to plant more trees, but it doesn't work. The area gets taken over by invasive species, and that forest is never the same again. We can see the impacts of Rapid 'Ōhi'a Death because it's very visible. What we're experiencing in our communities is a rapid local housing death, but it's not visible because you drive down the street, and the houses are still there. But the difference is, they're no longer homes: The heart and the spirit that lived in those homes, our local families, are being moved out. According to the Honolulu Department of Community Services report in 2015, at 80 percent occupancy, the average Airbnb unit brings in about 3.5 times more revenue than a long-term rental. This is why we've had about a 35 percent increase in illegal vacation units over the last two years. And it's not a coincidence that over that same two-year period, it's the first time in the State of Hawai'i we've had a decline in population.

"Now, I know we've all listened to the many, many good things that we've put in our budget that help our residents, but I want you to think about the human impacts that this disease that's spreading across our state is having. Yesterday, I shared an email from a retired fire battalion chief who's saying that his daughter is going to be moving to the mainland because she can't afford to live here anymore because the community's been taken over by vacation rentals. We passed an excellent bill that increases the amount of funding that's available to our kūpuna and their working adult children so the adult children can have some respite from caregiving and stay in the workforce and care for their kūpuna. How is that going to help this retired fire chief? His adult child is moving to the mainland, and many, many, many other families like that, too. My friend Warren who was in rental housing for 12 years—Chinese nationalist bought the housing, kicked him out. It's an investment property; they can make a lot more money by a vacation rental. He's lucky: He's in his fifties; he can work. Hawai'i has the highest proportion of our residents who are in rental housing than any other state. What's going to happen to them, particularly the kūpuna, who are on fixed income, who get moved out and now have to try and find housing and compete in a market where people can earn 3.5 times the amount of revenue by flipping to a vacation rental than they can from a long-term rental? My husband and I dream about having our adult daughters be able to move back to Hawai'i. I have very strong memories of my oldest, when my parents would take care of her on the weekends so my husband and I could go out for a date night, and watching her one time walk down the street holding both their hands when she was little. And I wish to have that opportunity myself, with a grandchild or grandchildren one day, if I'm so lucky. But I don't know if that's going to happen. It was always a heavy lift to get our kids back from the mainland because the cost of living was high here, and that was before these platforms existed, before it was so easy for people to hide behind the shield of the platform and to rent their apartments or their homes.

"I agree with what the senator from Pearl City said: It's very, very frustrating to sit here and watch the City and County of Honolulu not take action year after year after year. But in the past couple weeks, as the senators here have given me the opportunity to negotiate with the House, I've had a lot of talks with the planning directors and others on the neighbor islands where they are taking action, and they need help. The platforms are not violating any land-use laws. The county ability to enforce its land-use laws—it's irrelevant. The tax department has come to us and said, 'We need new authority to be able to manage these vacation rentals through the platforms because it's not possible to manage them one by one by one.' We have to make sure that the counties have that ability, and we should not be balancing our budget on these illegal operations because then we will become reliant upon those revenues and more resistant next year to giving the counties the authority to regulate.

"I know we're in a terrible position tonight, and, again, I really appreciate the flexibility many of you have given me to try and negotiate and carry the Senate position, and it's not our fault that the House hasn't done this. It is the House's fault. They even stripped out the little bit of language they had in House Draft 2 that required the tax department to share a minimal amount of information with the counties so that they could enforce their land-use laws, and that got stripped out in House Draft 3! It was an insult; it was such a minor give that the counties and the hotels all said, 'We'll take that! We'll take that version because it will put us in a position where at least we have a fighting chance,' and that got taken out in House Draft 3. And what got put in to House Draft 3 is that the information that's given to the tax department is confidential and **cannot be shared**.

“So the choice that we have tonight is, do we go for the money or do we hold firm to our position? And I know it’s a terrible choice that we’ve all been put in, but we’ve been put in it by the House. And I ask you—I know you’re thinking of the good programs that we’re funding in our budgets—but I ask you to think of the real human costs and what’s going to happen to our society as more and more of these homes turn into houses, where they lose their spirit and their heart of our native ‘ohana community system, and what that’s going to mean for our state over the long term. I ask that you join me and vote ‘no.’”

Senator Dela Cruz rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

“However the body decides to vote, so be it, but I just want to point out some facts. Council on Revenues came in, and that reduced \$80 million from our budget and a hole that we’re going to have to fix in the out-years. Collective bargaining came in, and that’s going to cost us way over \$100 million. I’m not sure what the financial outlook is going to be in the upcoming years, but I just want to point out some of the bills for which the subject-matter committees got WAM/FIN approval which may be impacted if the bill doesn’t pass. I just wish, as I had asked the subject-matter chair last week, to vote on this bill last week Thursday because that would’ve allowed the FIN chair and I to really determine if we can have FIN/WAM approval or not. It would’ve saved a lot of people’s time and effort. So that part, I think, bothers me, is that if we were going to vote this down, we should’ve voted it down last week because it impacts a lot of bills, which I think we’re going to have to look at, at some point, either recommitting or deferring, so I’ll just quickly go over them.

“We approved Filipino American World War II veterans burial grants. We approved State Procurement Office homelessness training procurement; FDA Food Safety Modernization Act; food certification training program appropriation; loan repayment healthcare professionals matching funds; suicide early intervention, prevention, education for Department of Health; Hawai‘i 2050 Sustainability Plan; He‘eia State Park appropriation; DBEDT–DOA study, impact marketing appropriation; UH Hawai‘i Pamantasan Council appropriation; agriculture theft and vandalism pilot project appropriation; culturally competent palliative care pilot program; industrial hemp state plan appropriations; Department of Agriculture aquaculture development program appropriations; Hawaii Public Housing Authority Section 8 vouchers; DHRD employment recruitment, experimental modernization administrative officer position, experimental modernization project; Hawaii Correctional System Oversight Commission; DLNR Rapid ‘Ōhi‘a Death appropriation; Hawai‘i Museum of Natural and Cultural History, appropriation to Bishop Museum; historic preservation rehabilitation tax credit; voting by mail; creative media and film industry special fund appropriation; HTDC appropriation; homelessness, Human Services, housing shelters, ohana zones pilot program; DOA agricultural disaster funds, agriculture loan revolving fund; UH student athletic program; HTDC activities research credit; homelessness, Hawaii Public Housing Authority, Human Services appropriation; motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit; Hawai‘i Community Development Authority stadium development district appropriation; Maui Health System appropriation; Cancer Center, liver and bile duct cancer appropriation; and Office of Energy appropriations. And those are just what we passed within the last two days, so there are other bills that are going to be impacted, and it would’ve been good to know that we weren’t going to have that \$46 million last week.

“DOTAX had mentioned that there’s a big difference between this bill and the bill that went to the governor several

years ago. It’s mandatory for platforms to collect GET and TAT using this bill. Platforms will be liable for GET and TAT as well. It also requires platforms to report name, address, property address, TAT, GET, and taxes paid. There are civil penalties. There are consequences for placing an ad without TAT number. There’s also potential violations of federal CDA and SCA laws, which the bill uses definitions now upheld in other jurisdictions. It also allows counties more aggressive actions, and the revenue estimate is \$46 million. Thank you.”

The Chair then called for a Roll Call vote.
