Senator Baker, Chair of the Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for S.B. No. 2462.

Senator Baker noted:

“This bill addresses medical cannabis, requiring the Department of Health to request a federal exemption to the Schedule I classification for medical cannabis here in Hawai‘i. CPH just recently received the re-referral, and the Committee has a hearing scheduled on the topic of medical cannabis with all of the other bills addressing this for consideration by CPH on January 31, and in order to combine it with the other measures on this topic, we request a waiver in order to add it to the agenda.”

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Baker announced that the Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health would be holding a public hearing on S.B. No. 2462 on Friday, January 31, 2020, at 9:30 a.m. in Conference Room 229.

The Chair then announced that there would be a leadership meeting in his office immediately following adjournment.
