

SEVENTEENTH DAY

Tuesday, February 11, 2020

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 11:32 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Ihara who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Sixteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Shimabukuro commended Mālia Ka'aihue and Duane DeSoto, and presented the following remarks:

"A strong part of the Hawaiian culture is 'ohana, the Hawaiian word for 'family.' The concept emphasizes that families are bound together, and members must cooperate and remember one another. 'Ohana extends beyond the core family to include blood-related, and can also be used informally, such as with close friends to the family or within an organization. Once in an 'ohana, it is a give-and-take relationship among the members, whether past, present, or future. This is part of the responsibilities and obligations of the makua, or parent: a big part of that kuleana, that responsibility, is to take care of the 'ohana. A lāhui rising and its foundation is formed by the makua generation. We take great pride in recognizing outstanding individuals who have demonstrated a strong commitment to the betterment of our society and who help to shape the lives of others through their ability to excel in their respective fields. These two individuals we honor today continue to take care of their 'ohana—their children, family members within the circle and out.

"Duane DeSoto excelled in surfing at a very young age and became a water sportsman, taking on championships and creating records in the sport of surfing. He most recently sailed aboard the *Hōkūle'a* on a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to participate in a four-year-long initiative to circumnavigate the globe by non-instrument navigation. He sailed from Aotearoa to Australia, across the Tasman Sea, along with the crew led by master navigator Bruce Blankenfeld. A devoted family man, Duane is now working to support the next generation of local and Native Hawaiian youth to build a deep and abiding passion for the sea through his nonprofit, Nā Kama Kai, or Children of the Sea, which works to empower youth by creating, conducting, and supporting ocean-based programs, specifically targeting ocean safety and conservation awareness in order to increase the capacity of youth in the community through Hawaiian values, culture, and environmental education.

"Mālia Ka'aihue is the president of DTL, a Hawaiian strategy studio she founded in 2014. Using her expertise in Hawaiian history, politics, and language, Mālia develops and executes strategies that are culturally appropriate, community-minded, and relevant to her clients. Mālia previously worked for WCIT Architecture, Pacific Basin Communications, and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. She attended the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, where she received a bachelor's degree in Hawaiian studies and language as well as a master's and doctorate degree in political science. Currently, she serves as a board member for the Native Hawaiian Legal Corporation, Reach the Runway, Ke Kula Kaiapuni 'o Ānuenuē, and Nā Kama Kai, an ocean-safety nonprofit she founded with her husband in 2008. Together with her husband, Duane, they have eight children: Laura, Micah, Keanuē, Puamakamae, Kala, Hokuwelo, Honua, and Wailana.

"With all of these challenges in today's world, their value to mālama their 'ohana, caring for their kūpuna, who once cared

for them, providing shelter for their 'ohana, they sought to understand the difficulty and importance of an education. They shared the mana'o to work hard and get ahead; they helped their children to start their own business and excel in school and in life.

"It is in the malama of Kā'elo and the rising of the Lā'au Kū Kahi, this 11th day of February 2020, that we commend Duane DeSoto and Mālia Ka'aihue for working hard at being a makua, for teaching those Hawaiian values as you raise your lāhui. Duane and Mālia, can you please stand? My esteemed colleagues, please help me to honor and congratulate these two individuals for being inspiring parents. Mahalo."

At this time, Jacob Ka'ōmakaokalā Aki shared an oli with the members of the Senate and guests.

The Chair announced that the members would greet the honorees following the conclusion of the Senate's remaining business.
