

## EIGHTEENTH DAY

## Wednesday, February 12, 2020

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Harimoto who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Seventeenth Day.

At this time, Senator Keohokalole commended Melody Kapilialoha MacKenzie, and presented the following remarks:

“On this third day of Hawaiian Caucus Week, I'm proud to honor an individual who has committed her career to advocating for Native Hawaiian families and issues. Melody Kapilialoha MacKenzie is a professor of law at the William S. Richardson School of Law, and is also the founding director of the Ka Huli Ao Center for Excellence in Native Hawaiian Law. After receiving her law degree as a member of the first class of the University of Hawai'i law school, she served as a law clerk to Chief Justice William S. Richardson of the Hawai'i Supreme Court. In 1980, she joined the staff of the Native Hawaiian Legal Corporation, eventually serving as senior staff attorney and executive director, and is also well-known for her work as the principal author of the *Native Hawaiian Rights Handbook* and the 1,400-page *Native Hawaiian Law: A Treatise*, the definitive resource for understanding the critical legal issues affecting the Native Hawaiian community. In 2005, she was instrumental in creating the Ka Huli Ao Center for Excellence in Native Hawaiian Law, an academic center that promotes education, scholarship, community outreach, and collaboration on issues of law, culture, and justice for Native Hawaiians and other Pacific and indigenous peoples.

“While often soft-spoken and reserved (for example, she was initially upset, very upset, when she found out that she would be honored here individually in both chambers of the Hawai'i State Legislature), her humble nature betrays the fact that she has had a giant impact on the lāhui. Instead, she lets her work speak for herself and truly embodies the Hawaiian value of ha'aha'a, or humility. The only regrettable outcome of this admirable quality is that the community might never fully come to know and appreciate how important an impact she has had on the lāhui and the pae 'āina. For nearly every significant Hawaiian issue over the last 40 years, Professor MacKenzie has been involved as an advocate, a counselor, a mentor, or even a recruiter. For example, when the Kaho'olawe landings took place by Hawaiian activists in 1976, she helped recruit young attorneys—including a young Hawaiian attorney named John Waihe'e—to defend the activists who were arrested and jailed during those landings. Her quality of service without seeking the limelight deserves recognition because it highlights a path that is often not pursued in this current climate of self-congratulation and -promotion. So today, we take this opportunity to thank her for a lifetime of service, and congratulate her and wish her well in future endeavors. Professor MacKenzie, please rise and be recognized by the Hawai'i State Senate.

“Mr. President, also joining her in the gallery are her 'ohana: husband Lawrence Araki, sister Irene Hi'ilei Chung, nephew David Keali'i MacKenzie, and niece Beth Ku'uleimaile MacKenzie, also cousin Lori MacKenzie. And also from the University of Hawai'i's William S. Richardson School of Law, we have Dean Avi Soifer, and from the Ka Huli Ao Center for Excellence in Native Hawaiian Law, we have Kapua Sprout, director; Susan Serrano, associate director; as well as legal

fellows Mahina Tuteur, Letani Peltier, U'ilani Tanigawa Lum, Ku'upuamae'ole Kiyuna, and Sabrina Gramberg. Members, can we please give them a round of applause? Also hiding in the crowd over there is Max Sword—why don't you stand up and be recognized? Mr. President, thank you.”

The Chair commented that, based on Senator Keohokalole's remarks, Melody MacKenzie is much more comfortable when she's in charge. Also, when the Chair walked in and congratulated her that morning, she shared that she was very nervous that morning, and he found it interesting that, with all of her accomplishments, this would make her nervous.

Senator Ihara rose to share brief, spontaneous remarks about the honoree, noting that he met Melody during the Constitutional Convention of 1978, and what a time it was. It was the birth of a whole generation of political leaders, civic leaders, attorneys, and scholars, and Senator Ihara wanted to acknowledge Melody for being a key player in nurturing that social ecosystem and community that we see flourishing today with high ethical standards, guided by what's best for all of us and rooted in our culture here in Hawai'i.

At 11:40 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
