Tuesday, February 16, 2021

The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2021, convened at 11:39 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with Senators Chang, Dela Cruz, English, Gabbard, Keith-Agaran, Lee, Rhoads, Shimabukuro, and Wakai present and participating via videoconference.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Sixteenth Day.
