

## THIRTIETH DAY

Tuesday, March 16, 2021

The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2021, convened at 11:31 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with Senators Chang, Dela Cruz, Gabbard, Keohokalole, Lee, Shimabukuro, and Wakai present and participating via videoconference.

Senator Keohokalole moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 981 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Baker and carried.

Senator Keohokalole then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of ELIZABETH CHAR as Director of the Department of Health, term to expire at noon on December 5, 2022, seconded by Senator Baker.

Senator Keohokalole spoke in strong support of the nominee as follows:

"Colleagues, we consider today Dr. Elizabeth Char for confirmation as director of the Department of Health. Dr. Char is an emergency physician by training, and a graduate of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa John A. Burns School of Medicine. After completing residency training in California, she returned to Hawai'i to practice emergency medicine at Queen's Medical Center. Her work in emergency medicine also led her to serve as the medical director for AMR Hawaii, the Honolulu and Kaua'i fire departments, O'ahu EMS, and the Emergency Services Department of the City and County of Honolulu. Since 1998, she has also been an assistant clinical professor in JABSOM's surgery department, and was formerly a staff lecturer at Kapi'olani Community College.

"Dr. Char is a dedicated and knowledgeable public servant who is ideally suited to lead the Department of Health during these trying times. She has a proven track record of team leadership in the medical community and an ideal blend of medical and administrative expertise spanning both public and private sectors. Dr. Char's entire professional career has focused on helping others through the practice of medicine, specifically emergency medicine, where the patient requires immediate critical intervention. Colleagues, in September of last year, our entire state was in need of immediate medical intervention as we were experiencing a second shutdown on O'ahu and the largest spike in cases from the pandemic to date. Dr. Char responded to the call to serve and stepped in as interim director of the Department of Health amidst the most challenging period of the greatest public health crisis in a hundred years. Since then, she oversaw the department's pandemic efforts, including testing, contact tracing, isolation and quarantine, vaccination, and other disease outbreaks and public health programs, which affect the welfare of our state. Thanks to her and her Department of Health team, Hawai'i has the lowest infection rate in the nation. Her leadership is critical as we continue our ongoing efforts to fight COVID-19.

"Dr. Char is well-qualified and has shown a steadfast dedication and tireless commitment to her role as director. Her collaborative approach to leadership and willingness to seek involvement from government agencies and private members of the healthcare community in developing programs and policies since her appointment has brought direction and clarity to the department. It's been a pleasure working with her closely, and I ask for your support in confirming her as director of the Department of Health. Mahalo."

Senator Baker rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

“I, too, join the chair of the Health committee in supporting Elizabeth Char as the director of Health and in asking all my colleagues to support her. She has been not only an amazing advocate for the health needs in our community, but she has the temperament and the background to do a really solid leadership role that the Department of Health needs. I’m pleased to join with Chair Keohokalole and others in asking all of our colleagues to join me in voting to confirm Dr. Elizabeth Char. Mahalo.”

The Chair then offered the following comments:

“I’d just like to offer one comment and try not to get in too much trouble. Senator Dela Cruz, I wanted to thank you. Ironically, it’s almost a year to the day when we were unable to get answers to questions from a medical professional in what would be best practices for us going forward as we had a close contact of a positive. We were looking for policies and procedures, and you arranged for Dr. Char, who was not part of the Hawai’i state government, to come to the capitol, and 22 or 23 of us met in my conference room and were able to ask her questions and get direct answers. I appreciate how quickly you put that together to assist us and how readily available Dr. Char has been and has continued to be, no matter what capacity that she has held, so I find it ironic that we’re here almost a year to the day of that interaction with Dr. Char.”

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

At this time, Senator Keohokalole introduced Dr. Elizabeth Char, newly confirmed director of the Department of Health, who was present and participating via videoconference.

The Chair extended additional congratulations to Dr. Char.

So I welcome you to go out and meet some of them. They’re downstairs in the rotunda until 12:15. Thank you, Mr. President.”
