The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2021, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with Senators Chang, Dela Cruz, English, Gabbard, Ihara, Keohokalole, Lee, Moriwaki, Rhoads, San Buenaventura, and Shimabukuro present and participating via videoconference.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Third Day.
