Monday, April 5, 2021

ORDER OF THE DAY

THIRD READING

H.B. No. 891, H.D. 2, S.D. 1:

Senator Rhoads moved that H.B. No. 891, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator Keohokalole.

Senator Rhoads then offered the following amendment (Floor Amendment No. 4) to H.B. No. 891, H.D. 2, S.D. 1:

SECTION 1. House Bill No. 891, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, section 12, is amended by amending page 31, lines 20 to 21, to read as follows:

"SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2022"

Senator Rhoads moved that Floor Amendment No. 4 be adopted, seconded by Senator Keohokalole.

Senator Rhoads spoke in support of the amendment as follows:

"Mr. President, there was some confusion when I made the announcement about what the effective date of this bill would be in committee, and this will clarify that the effective date is January 1, 2022."

The motion to adopt Floor Amendment No. 4 was put by the Chair and carried.

By unanimous consent, H.B. No. 891, H.D. 2, S.D. 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS," was placed on the calendar for Third Reading on Wednesday, April 7, 2021.

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1518 (H.B. No. 416, H.D. 2, S.D. 2):

Senator Rhoads moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1518 be adopted and H.B. No. 416, H.D. 2, S.D. 2, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator Keohokalole.

Senator San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"I want my constituents to know that, by passing this bill, we do not condemn humane tethering, with swivels or without swivels. My concern was the mentioning of tethering with or without swivels. This bill does not ban humane tethering at all, and I urge the advocates who, every year, ask us to pass an antitethering law, to teach my constituents and others how to humanely tether strong, large animals. Otherwise, unnecessary dog bites and dog deaths may occur as we move away from the one-bite rule. So, for those reasons, I stand in support."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1518 was adopted and H.B. No. 416, H.D. 2, S.D. 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SECTION 711-1109, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:
