At this time, Senator Acasio honored the late Edith Kanaka'ole for being designated an honoree of the 2023 American Women Quarters, a program of the U.S. Mint. Senator Acasio noted that Ms. Kanaka'ole had lived in Hilo her entire life and had been a venerated Hawaiian cultural icon, kumu hula, composer, chanter, educator, and a key influence in the Hawaiian renaissance of the 1970s. Senator Acasio further noted that Ms. Kanaka'ole had dedicated her life to teaching Native Hawaiian and Polynesian traditional culture, history, and language through her now-internationally acclaimed halau hula and later as an instructor at Hawai'i Community College at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. Senator Acasio explained that Ms. Kanaka'ole would be sharing this honor with four other women trailblazers: Eleanor Roosevelt, former first lady and first chair of the United Nations Commission on Human Rights; Bessie Coleman, first African American and Native American woman pilot; Jovita Idár, Mexican American journalist; and Maria Tallchief, a Native American and America's first major prima ballerina.
