Senator DeCoite moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 3685 and S.C.R. No. 195 be adopted, seconded by Senator Fevella.

Senator Rhoads rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"I was a D.C. resident before my wife and I moved here to Hawai'i 25 years ago, and it's just such an obvious injustice that over 600,000 people have to pay federal taxes but do not have full federal representation: they have no representatives in the Senate; they have a non-voting delegate in the House. They do get to vote for President, but it's just so fundamentally un-American, and when you pay your federal taxes in the district, it's really exasperating, too, to know that you're paying just as much as everybody else, but you don't have the same representation. Mahalo."

Senator Riviere rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

"I respect the comments of the previous speaker regarding the D.C. situation; however, my preference would be that the residents, maybe, that we consider them becoming part of Maryland as opposed to a new state. So, I'm going to be voting in opposition to S.C.R. 195. Thank you."

Senator Baker rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"I rise in support of the resolution that Senator Rhoads authored, and I just wanted to ask that the words of that senator be inserted into the Journal as my own. (The Chair so ordered, by reference only.) I used to work in D.C. as well. Mahalo."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 195, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ENACT FEDERAL LEGISLATION GRANTING STATEHOOD TO THE PEOPLE OF WASHINGTON, D.C.," was adopted, with Senator Riviere voting "No."

At this time, the Chair announced that there would be a leadership meeting immediately following adjournment.
