The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2022, convened at 11:43 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator Fevella who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Fourth Day.

Senator Kim rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"There is no shortage of tough issues, and this body especially has certainly worked on and embraced a number of tough issues and looking at the best interest of our state. House Bill 2024 is certainly one of those very tough issues that we need to deal with and not just ignore it. As the Senate passed out Senate Draft 1, it's in the Ways and Means committee, and we are continually working on it. As I said, the bill is a work in progress—it is not a perfect bill—there are a lot of moving parts to it. And so we are consistently working on it to see that we can come up with a reasonable and a workable proposal, and so it really bothers me that the governor, last night in an interview, came out and talked about how the bill would kill astronomy because, certainly, S.D. 1 shows that this body is really concerned about astronomy and how it is important to our state.

"I would like to remind this body that it was the governor who placed the moratorium on Mauna Kea that caused a lot of the community concerns and the problems that we are now experiencing with the observatories and the astronomy program. Also, it was the governor who signed the letter to the Board of Regents—and the regents asked him to do it—so that they could delay adopting the administrative rules, which, again, led to some of the concerns that is going on with the community.

"I would like to also point out that never once since we got this measure has the governor reached out to this body, reached out to me—has never given us any suggestions, did not put in any testimony. And so, certainly, we need to work together. I've reached out with the House; I've reached out to the working group, reached out to the observatories, with UH: we've been working on this measure. And so the governor has been silent, and that's fine. If you want to be silent on it, it's okay. But then to come out and to then criticize us and saying we're killing astronomy, I think that he needs to step up and he should contact us, and if he has a proposal, I'm more than open to it—I've been very open to all the suggestions, read all the testimonies and taking that into consideration. And so I challenge the governor to work with us so we can find and craft something because if we do nothing, I believe that the protests will continue and that we are not going to resolve anything. Thank you, Mr. President."
