Friday, January 27, 2023

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2023, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator Fevella who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Dela Cruz welcomed Maksim Yervandyan, who is from Armenia and currently a junior attending Kailua High School. Senator Dela Cruz noted that Mr. Yervandyan was here through the Future Leaders Exchange program, which provides opportunities for high school students to spend a year in the United States, and that the International Hospitality Center had been honored in receiving grantees for placement in Hawai'i.

Senator Inouye introduced students from the Secondary Student Conference who were visiting the Capitol.
