Monday, February 6, 2023

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2023, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator DeCoite who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Eleventh Day.

Tre' was a three-year veteran of the Maui Fire Department, and at 24 years of age, he gave his life to help our community during the massive floods. If not for his heroic acts in removing the debris, many other families would have suffered. We express our heartfelt condolences to his family and his friends, and we'll remember him as a true friend and hero of the community."

Senator Kidani congratulated the PAC-5 varsity wāhine, including her granddaughter Kamalani Marlier, for winning the Division II soccer championship by defeating Kapa'a.

Senator Fevella introduced staff members of the Senate Minority Research Office: Joyce Oliveira, Tesha Malama, Elizabeth Tatofi, Nia Tatofi, and Raiza Dalofin. Senator Fevella also recognized members of his office staff who were seated in the gallery: Kona Purdy, Christian Ulufanua, and Christopher Shellko. Senator Fevella then acknowledged Ernest Chang, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session.

The Chair noted that the Kapa'a girls basketball team had won its first Division II state championship, a first for Kaua'i. The Chair then observed that, by beating Konawaena, 'Iolani had won its fourth consecutive Division I girls basketball championship, and that for the last eight or nine years, that title had been won by either 'Iolani or Konawaena. The Chair concluded that young ladies in Hawai'i high schools had achieved great things over the past weekend.
