Wednesday, March 22, 2023

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2023, convened at 12:08 p.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Lee introduced participants of the Academic Fellowship on Environmental Issues from the Young Southeast Asian Leaders Initiative who were seated in the gallery. Senator Lee explained that the program, hosted by the East-West Center, would bring students from Southeast Asian countries to Hawai'i and then on to Washington, D.C.

Senator Elefante acknowledged Pearl City High School bandmaster Chadwick Kamei, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session, and Hall of Fame bandmaster Michael D. Nakasone, who were present in the gallery.

Senator Kim welcomed two guests from Madeira, Portugal. Seated in the gallery were Isabel Gouveia, a PhD researcher in global studies at the University of Portugal, and Eugénio Perregil, president and founder of the Center for Studies and Development, Education, Culture and Social of Calheta as well as director of the scientific magazine *Aoeste*.

The Chair noted that part of the guests' mission was to discuss the 145th anniversary of the Portuguese arriving to work in Hawai'i.

"On the matter of advise and consent, this has obviously now become a large issue in the press, and members who had not had the chance to meet with Mr. Glenn now realize that any vote that they cast will probably be asked for the rationale and supporting statement to the vote, and we've been asked to defer this till Friday so that those who have not met with Mr. Glenn will have the opportunity.

"Also, it has been reported in the media that there have been discussions about Mr. Glenn's nomination in caucus, and on

Monday, we talked about Senator Rhoads and the ethics bills, and on Tuesday, we had Erika Moritsugu and an associate from the White House talk to us about issues in the White House, and I had to reassure the members of the caucus that this has never been discussed in caucus until today.

“I have talked to all of the members in the caucus, and there isn’t a member who has come forward to tell me that they felt coerced in any way by Senator Dela Cruz or Senator Kidani on how to cast a vote, but they did feel some pressure from the Water-Land chair in how they were going to vote. It is routine for Senator Kidani as the vice president, Senator Kanuha as the majority leader, and other members of the leadership team to continually take the temperature of where members of the caucus are leaning. And so, with that request, with the attention that has been brought onto this nominee’s vote, I will ask, if there are no objections, that we defer this item to Friday.”
