

## FORTY-FOURTH DAY

**Tuesday, April 4, 2023**

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2023, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Third Day.

At this time, Senator Gabbard noted that representatives from public agencies and nonprofit organizations who are raising awareness about the ocean were present in the gallery. Senator Gabbard urged the members to visit their exhibits out on the Rotunda to learn about coral reefs, sea level rise, limu, and more. Senator Gabbard then thanked the organizations and agencies for their work. Present in the gallery were representatives from Brigham Young University–Hawaii; the Conservationist Collective; the Coral Reef Alliance; Department of Land and Natural Resources Division of Aquatic Resources, Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, and Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement; For the Fishes; Friends of Hanauma Bay; Hawai'i Coral Reef Rights; Hawai'i Fisheries Extension program under National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Fisheries; Hawai'i Green Fee Coalition; Hawai'i Institute of Marine Biology; Hawai'i Institute of Marine Biology's Coral Resilience Lab and the He'eia National Estuarine Research Reserve; Kai Palaoa; Kalanihale; Kuleana Coral Restoration; Mālama Manō; Mālama Maunaloa; Mālama Pūpūkea-Waimea; Maui Nui Makai Network; Miloli'i Community-Based Subsistence Fishing Area; Moana 'Ohana; Office of Hawaiian Affairs; Papahānaumokuākea Marine Debris Project; Resources Legacy Fund; Surfriider Foundation; the Nature Conservancy, Hawai'i and Palmyra; UH Mānoa School of Life Sciences; Wastewater Alternatives and Innovations; and Wild Kids and World Ocean Day.

Senator Keohokalole introduced members of his staff who were seated in the gallery: UH Mānoa legislative interns Joey Brown and Keya Rivera; committee staff Jaymee Weisberg, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session, Jaren Tengan, Randall Wat, and Kaila Kaawaloa; and office manager Jules Peleiholani.

Senator Chang, on behalf of Senator Lee and himself, introduced teachers and students from the International Baccalaureate global politics class of Kaiser High School, located in District 25. Present in the gallery were teachers Riker Kasamoto and Paul Balazs, and students Melania Ali Heron, Maxwell R. Calandra, Sacha Alialani R. Des Pres, Beckett C. Dompe, Larissa C. Goloveyko, Matthew Iwamasa, Justin T. Laxamana, Macy Matsushima, Dylan H. Miyamoto, Kai Paar, Santiago Wolfe, and Kellie Wu. Senator Chang stated that he and Senator Lee had had a great conversation with the students that morning, and that some of them may be sitting in Senate seats before too long.

The Chair commented, in good humor, that hopefully the students would choose to reside in Senate District 24 or 25 and not branch out.

On behalf of Senate President Kouchi, Senator DeCoite introduced constituents who were involved with Boys & Girls Club. Seated in the galley were Kaua'i High School ninth grader David Braman; Kaua'i High School tenth grader Nainoa Hirokane; Kaua'i High School tenth grader Michaela Alcaraz; staff member Dallas Albao; and clubhouse director Asaka Herman.

Senator DeCoite then welcomed Maximo Melgar Martich, a constituent from the Boys & Girls Club Haiku clubhouse who was present in the gallery.

Senator Keohokalole recognized Dr. Beth England, a volunteer in his office for the last two years, who was seated in the gallery.

Senator Shimabukuro welcomed member Shysen Lopes and clubhouse director Kekoa Tupua of the Boys & Girls Club Nanakuli Teen Center, who were present in the gallery.

Senator Kanuha recognized and honored 2023 Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii Youth of the Year honorees, and presented the following remarks:

“Colleagues, today we are pleased to acknowledge the finalists for the 2023 Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii State Youth of the Year. The Youth of the Year program, which takes place annually, recognizes exceptional teenagers for their commendable choices and positive behavior. This distinguished program emphasizes the development of character and leadership skills while celebrating the service of club members to their club, community, and family. It also highlights academic performance, ethical values, life goals, poise, and public-speaking ability. The program's primary objective is to cultivate the personal growth and leadership abilities of young people. By recognizing their service and leadership qualities, the Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii Youth of the Year program encourages teens to continue making positive contributions to their communities. It's an opportunity for outstanding teens to be recognized for their achievements and inspire others to strive for excellence. To start off today's recognition, I would like to yield the floor to our colleague from 'Ewa Beach, who will introduce our first Youth of the Year finalist.”

Senator Fevella rose to present the following remarks:

“Colleagues, I have the great pleasure of introducing our first Youth of the Year finalist, hails from 96706—south 'Ewa Beach—Melanie McLean. As a sophomore at James Campbell High School and a representative of Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii Hale Pono Clubhouse, Melanie is very involved in our 'Ewa Beach community and assisting with various volunteers such as parking lot detail, which is very important in our community because we have no parking—not yet, though, not yet—volunteering at the parking lot for James Campbell High School football games, organizing food drives with her church, helping with renovations and upkeep and cleaning up of the Boys & Girls Club, and participating in the junior leader intercession programs. She's a bright young woman with a grade point average of 3.6 who participates in the Navy Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (Navy JROTC) and advancement via individual determination (or AVID) programs, both of which are designed to prepare students for college life beyond high school. Melanie is also an active member of various clubs, including leadership training, and, again, I just wanted to thank her for being one of the finalists for Youth of the Year. I now yield the floor to Senator McKelvey.”

Senator McKelvey rose to present the following remarks:

“I am pleased to introduce to you and the members our second Youth of the Year finalist. Hailing from West Maui and representing the Boys & Girls Club of Maui Lahaina Clubhouse is Arissa Kahaiali'i of the esteemed Kaiali'i 'ohana—please stand. Arissa actively participates in various community service activities, including the Maui Teen Expo planning committee, the Lā 'Ohana Thank You First Responders Event, and several events as a member of the Boys & Girls Club of Lahaina Clubhouse. Not only are Arissa's academic achievements

impressive with a 3.4 GPA, but she also serves as the trombone section leader in the Kamehameha Schools Maui band. She is a Maui Interscholastic League athlete in swimming, water polo, and volleyball as well, and Arissa's dedication and commitment extend beyond her community service and academic pursuits. She's an active member of the Boys & Girls Club of Maui, participating in Torch Club, Keystone, SMART Girls, Power Hour, Project Learn, UPS Road Code, and Leaders in Training. She was also recognized as Lahaina Clubhouse Youth of the Month for August in 2022, and was named 2023 Boys & Girls Club of Maui Youth of the Year.

"Arissa, your accomplishments and achievements serve as a shining example to those in Maui community and across Hawai'i, and I wish you best of luck in this competition. Mr. President, I now yield the floor to my colleague from Kalihi and Moanalua."

Senator Kim rose to present the following remarks:

"I have the pleasure of recognizing another one of our Youth of the Year finalists. Representing the United States Army Garrison Fort Shafter Youth Center is Alia Fatty—Alia, if you would rise. Mr. President, Alia is a high school senior at Moanalua High School who is committed to serving her community and peers. Alia currently holds multiple leadership roles in the Torch Club, the youth center, and is the president of the Keystone Club. Furthermore, Alia serves as an ambassador for the World Language Learning Center, and played an instrumental role in launching the Be a Star program at Fort Shafter. Her passion for volunteering is evident through her 165 hours of community service at the teen center, where she, through her 165 hours, enjoys participating in art and cooking projects. Alia is an exemplary student leader, and I wish her the best of luck in this year's Youth of the Year competition. Now, I'd like to yield the floor to my neighbor from Senate District 15."

Senator Wakai rose to present the following remarks:

"Colleagues, our last finalist competing in the Youth of the Year competition is Madeline Myers—Madeline, if you could please stand? Madeline is representing the Joint Base Pearl Harbor—Hickam Teen Center. She actively participates in her community and holds the position of vice president in the Keystone Club, where she collaborates with her peers to organize community events and other activities at the teen center. Apart from her exceptional volunteer work, Madeline has also showcased her talents by competing and winning in two categories at the local level of the Boys & Girls Club of America National Arts competition. Additionally, she is a member of various clubs, such as the cooking club and the Dungeons & Dragons club. Colleagues, please join me in congratulating our last Youth of the Year finalist, Madeline Myers. Mr. President, I now yield the floor back to our esteemed majority leader."

Senator Kanuha rose and stated:

"Mr. President, before we end, I would like to draw attention to some esteemed guests who have joined us in the gallery. These are students who participated in the Youth of the Year competition on their own respective islands, and I know some of them have already been recognized. As you are well aware, this is a highly competitive event, and all of the students who competed are exceptional in their own right. Could I ask that all of our Youth of the Year honorees who are present in the chamber today please stand and be recognized? Mahalo for being here, and mahalo to the finalists that we have on the floor. Mr. President, I request a recess at the appropriate time so that we can have the privilege of meeting our distinguished guests."

The Chair made the following comments:

"Before calling for the recess, I had the opportunity and pleasure of going to the Auditorium this morning and hearing the finalists make their presentations from the Auditorium stage. Ms. Myers was first, and we ended with Ms. McLean. The first three used the microphone, like most of us are doing here this morning, but Ms. McLean announced to the audience that she had a powerful voice and a microphone was not needed, which, based on my experience with Senator Fevella, seems to be a trait of the 'Ewa Beach area. They were all excellent in their presentations, and I do not envy the judges in having to determine which is going to be the ultimate winner."
