

FIFTIETH DAY

Monday, April 17, 2023

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2023, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator Fukunaga who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Ninth Day.

At this time, Senator Moriwaki acknowledged John Leong, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session. Accompanying him in the gallery were members of Senator Moriwaki's staff: office manager Charles Izumoto and Venus Delos Santos.
