The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator Keohokalole recognized parents, teachers, and students from the Christian Homeschoolers of Hawaii who were present in the gallery and visiting to witness the legislative process in action.

Senator Aquino acknowledged former state senator Clarence Nishihara, who had served in the Senate for 18 years and was seated in the gallery.

The Chair noted that Senator Nishihara possessed a green thumb and tremendous calamansi fruit.
