At this time, Senator McKelvey rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"When you watch the Super Bowl this weekend and you root on the 49ers, check out the coin toss because our own Lahainaluna kids are going to be there to be part of the coin toss—to bring great honor, I think, to everybody in Hawai'i in doing so. I wanted to give a special shoutout to the NFL and their charity partners. They've made an amazing donation to the kids, both them and the little ones (the Pop Warner guys). And so, on behalf of the community and everybody, it'll be a great moment, but it'll be for all of Hawai'i, so thank you. Go, Niners."

The Chair made the following comments:

"Along those lines, Senator McKelvey, I got home in time to turn my television on, and it went to KGMB and CBS broadcasts of the NFL Honors, and their morning news anchor, Gayle King, introduced a segment featuring the total devastation and what occurred in Lahaina six months ago. And in the segment, it then went into the Lahainaluna football team players and coaches—what they meant to the community and how the community is now trying to heal and rebuild. So, if you

have an opportunity to find that NFL awards segment, toward the last 20 minutes, I believe, of the broadcast, they did feature both Lahaina and the Lahainaluna football team. It was done very tastefully and, I think, really put the best of Lahainaluna, the football team, and the community of Lahaina forward, and I appreciate them featuring what has happened in that light. And then the young men were there introduced and the coaches and received a standing ovation from those in attendance for the event."
